After the Oakley's lost control, the theatre continued to show first run movies under the name Worth Theatre. Things were going along well in the 1950's and 1960's until.....the advent of the multi-plex theater. These theatres had 6,8,10 or more screens showing multiple movies at one location. The single

movie house could not complete with the big theaters. They either had to re-invent themselves or close up. Many closed up and their buildings were converted to other uses or have been torn down. Well, the Oakley now Worth theater reinvented themselves to be an "Arts Theatre." First under the name Playboy until they were sued by the Play-

boy corporation and then they operated under the name of the Playtoy Theatre much to the discernment of the citizens of Lake Worth and the local commission. They tried to close them down for several years and then something happened at the Playtoy that affected theatres across the United States. Next week you'll learn what happened.

Teachers Hold Reception in New Building

Preparatory to opening public schools of Lake Worth, for the 1928-29 term, Professor C. I. Hollingsworth and his teaching staff are holding open house at the new Junior-Senior High school building this evening from 8 to 10 o'clock, with the local school trustees and the teachers acting as hosts to the public.

The new junior high school building, containing 22 rooms, 17 of them class rooms, and the new gymnasium will be thrown open to the public for inspection.

Teachers will be in their respective rooms ready to answer any questions that parents may care to ask in regard to the school work, and aides will be on hand to show the visitors through the building.

The old senior high school building which now connects with the new building will also be open for inspection. Considerable repairs have been made to the building during the summer months, most of them necessitated by damaged roofs.

Hon. W. A. Boutwell, chairman of the school

secretary, Mrs. W. S. Aldridge, comprising the board of trustees, Principal Hollingsworth, and Assistant Principal L. M. Hamblin will be on hand to receive the guests. Among the prominent guests will be Capt. A. S. Anderson, Dr. J. R. Cason, and H. P. Jackson, comprising the county, school board County Superintendent Joe A. Youngblood, and Lake Worth chamber of commerce and city officials.

Modern Equipment For Cooking and Serving Installed in High School Basement

A cafeteria, designed to take care of the needs of pupils of the junior-senior high school and the west grade school has been installed in the basement of the old high school building, and while it will not be completed for a week or ten days after school opens, arrangements have been made to serve sandwiches and light lunches in the building. Mrs. T. M. Stapleton, of North A street, has been employed by the school trustees to handle the caf-

eteria. The cafeteria will be electrically equipped throughout, including a modern refrigeration plant.

Mrs. Stapleton is considered an expert in cafeteria management. She has had ten years' experience as dietitian in a New Orleans cafeteria and also has had six years' teaching experience.
