‘No’ to time change, ‘yes’ to tax increase

It could be a case of “you win some, you lose some” for Russell Countians as a plan to switch to eastern time was quashed, but an increase in the county occupational tax was passed this week.

Monday, at the regular, monthly meeting of the Russell County Fiscal Court, the governing body voted unanimously to “re-scind” a plan to change Russell County from Central Standard Time (CST) to

Eastern Standard Time (EST).

Russell County Judge Executive Randy Marcum recently introduced the plan, and after much public discussion and debate, the issue was brought before the court.

With consideration to “table” the time change, Fourth District Magistrate Steve Richardson set things in motion to do away with the plan entirely.

Last Thursday, at the monthly meeting of the Russell Springs City Council, the announcement of Public Work Supervisor Terry Russell’s retirement, and City Councilman Tom Holt’s resignation was made by Mayor

In a letter dated March 8, Holt tendered his resignation “effective immediately” to Russell Springs City Clerk Christopher Ramsey.
