Rebecca Lynn Owens was named valedictorian, and Thomas Andrew Canada was named salutatorian of the Russell County High School Class of 1993.

Members of the Russell County Arts Council signed a contract with McLean and Sons Construction Company to begin renovation of the Star Theatre.

The Russell County High School Girls Softball team rolled over the competition in the 12th Region Tournament to emerge with its second trip to the state tournament in three seasons.

McCreary County defeated the Laker baseball team to claim the 47th District title.

## May 26, 1983

Russell Sportswear surpassed the 1,000 employee mark.

William W. Magruder, General Manager of Duo County Telephone Co-op, was elected President of the Kentucky Telephone Association.

Seven Russell County residents graduated from Lindsey Wilson College. Graduates included: Charles Wayne Emerson, Barbara Estes, Linda M. Grider, Jeffery Alan Hubbard, Alan Dale Loy, Glenna Hoover Stiff, and Lena R. Williams. The Lakers fell to Rowan County 2-1 in a Sectional Tourney. Buddy Bernard, Jeff Cook, and Todd Whittle were on the Sectional Tournament Team. The Lakers finished the season 24-6.
