Preschool Registration



Hi Friends,

In the front page story about Representative Brandon Reed in the Feb. 7 issue of the Greensburg Record-Herald, cerebral palsy (CP) was described as a "disease that affects a person's balance and ability to walk."

As a person who also has this condition,

I wanted to provide a more accurate definition. Cerebral palsy is not a disease. The Mayo Clinic describes it as a group of disorders which affects muscles and posture.

In fact, the condition affects people very differently depending on the type and severity of the case. Symptoms vary and can

range from a lack of muscle control to significant challenges with sight or hearing.

It's also worth noting that the causes are not yet fully understood and the medical community is still learning about symptoms and treatment, especially for adults.

The CDC's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring Network estimates as many as 1 in every 345 Americans may have some form of cerebral palsy. Thank you for the opportunity to share more about it!
