

GCMS Track & Field hosts CKMSAC

Lady Dragons win, Dragons runners-up

The Green County Lady Dragon Track and Field Team dominated the Central Kentucky Middle School Athletic Conference meet last Thursday night. They set three new school records and out scored the nearest competition 128-37. The boys' squad finished runner up to a very talented and experienced Campbellsville Middle School team.

Scout Brockman broke her own school records in the discus and shot put (discus-106-08, shot put-39-05) to win both events and claim the #1 spot in both going into Saturday's Middle School State Meet. Dayni Coffey joins Brockman in the school record book, breaking the GCMS girls' record in the 400m dash with a time of 1:08.05 to win that event. Coffey also PRed in the 200m dash for the win and won pole vault. Coffey will compete at State in pole vault.

Riley Coffey won the 1600m and 3200m runs (after doing the same Tuesday night for Region wins). R. Coffey will compete in the 3200m run at Middle School State. The 4x800m relay team (R. Coffey, Rylee Feese, Lillie Creason, and Kody Pruitt) won the conference title and qualified for the State Meet.

Carly Goff hit a big PR of 4-08 to win high jump and qualify for State. Molly Dixon won triple jump and will compete at State, as well. Callee Talbott finished second to Brockman in shot put and discus. True to recent form, Talbott threw for personal records in both events and has qualified for the Middle School State Meet where she is ranked in the top five in both events.

Dixon claimed first place in the 100m hurdles and 300m hurdles at the CKMSAC meet. The Lady Dragon 4x400m relay team (D. Coffey, Goff, Bekaha Pruitt, and Dixon) were also conference champs. Lillie Creason won the 800m run with a personal record time. Rylee Feese took second place honors in the 800m run.

Emma Rouse set new personal best marks in the 100m dash and pole vault. Rouse was conference runner up in each of those events, placed third in long jump, and fourth in the 200m dash. Goff was second in long jump and third in the 400m dash. Kody Pruitt was second in the 1600m run and 3200m runs. Bekaha Pruitt was third in triple jump and fifth in the 100m and 200m dashes.

For the Dragons, Darius Anderson won triple jump and was second in the 400m dash. He will compete at Middle School State in both events, along with high jump (he did not compete in high jump at CKMSAC, but had previously qualified). Cayden Cecil won pole vault and will compete at State.

Larson Matney set a new personal best time in the 300m hurdles which landed him in second place at conference and a qualifying mark for the State Meet. Thrower Damon Edwards had personal best marks in the discus (third place) and shot put (fourth place) and will represent the green and gold at the State Meet on Saturday.

The Dragon 4x800m relay team (Cecil, Eddie Pickard, Logan Weddle, and Cody Swary) were conference champs. Swary won the boys' 3200m run and was second in the 1600m run. Weddle was second in the 800m run and third in the 1600m.

Demetrius Hancock had a big night. Hancock set new personal best times in the 200m dash (second place) and 400m dash (third place). Hancock was also conference runner up in long jump. Matney set a new PR in triple jump for second place. Matney was third in the 100m hurdles. Darius Anderson was third in the 200m dash.

The 4x200m relay team (D. Anderson, Wyatt Dotson, Matney, and Hancock) sprinted to a second place finish. The 4x100m relay team (Quentin Anderson, Tyren Anderson, Johnny Drury, and Dotson) placed third. Also placing third was the 4x400m relay team (Q. Anderson, Eddie Pickard,

In the 800m run; Price took third place, Pickard was fourth, and Curry placed fifth. Pickard was sixth in the 1600m run. Q. Anderson leaped to a fourth place finish in the long jump and had a personal best time in the 400m for a sixth place finish. Thrower Carter Wright placed sixth in discus and ninth in shot put.

Logan Weddle was conference runner up in pole vault. Johnny Drury had a personal best time for a fifth place finish in the 300m hurdles. Tyren Anderson was fifth in high jump and Drury was sixth. Wyatt Dotson was seventh in the 100m and 200m dashes. T. Anderson was eighth in the 200m and ninth in the 100m dash.
