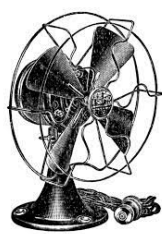




Leander and Maggie Hayes with their children, left to right, Euna, Eunice, and Robert Talmadge Hayes. Taken about 1895.

May 29, 2013 Memorial Day events - Family members and Veterans of Foreign Wars members remembered and honored deceased veterans at local cemeteries on Memorial Day.

Amnesty program - Green County Judge-Executive Misty Edwards announced that a tire amnesty would be held at the Kentucky Department of Transportation Headquarters on Columbia Highway.

DYW chosen - Kelsey Scott was chosen the Green County Distinguished Young Woman for 2014.

Golden Anniversary celebration - John and Bonnie McCloughan will celebrate their Golden Wedding Anniversary June 1.

May 28, 2003 Seniors receive diplomas - The 112 seniors of GCHS have received their diplomas. Kamini Taylor and Nathan Vaughn were named valedictorian and salutatorian of the class.

Cave injured - Amanda Cave received foot, leg and hand injuries when she was run over by a truck in the school parking lot after Class Night.

Veterans honored - Three American Legion members, Dr. Robert Simmons, Garnett Gupton and Brooks Edwards were recognized for fifty years of service to the American Legion.

Students create mural - GCHS art students, Anthony Shofner and Jonathan Milby, created a Dragon mural inside the boys' basketball locker room.

May 26, 1993 May Primary election winners - Green County voters went to the polls and chose County Judge-Executive candidates, Republican Morris Goff and Democrat Harry Kessler, Sheriff Ronnie Marcum, Democrat, and Republican Jeff Whitlow, to be voted upon in the General Election this fall.

Dowell earned GED certificate - Ruth Dowell earned her GED certificate when she was eighty-four years old. During the 1930s, Dowell delivered mail by horseback from Mell to Cork for seven years.

Polio vaccine available - Type III oral polio vaccine is available at the Green County Health Department. Seventy per cent of Green County residents have taken Types I and II.

Winners in governor's race - The winners in Green County in the governor's race are Democrat Edward T. "Ned" Breathitt with 1042 votes to A. B. "Happy" Chandler's 864 votes. The two will face off in the General Election in November.

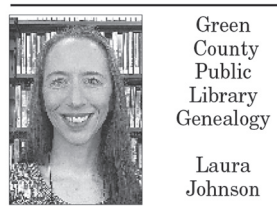

Leander and Maggie Hayes were always active in their church. Eunice married James Grover Givens in 1917. They had 5 children: Margaret, Barbara Jean, James T., Maurice, and Buford Givens. Eunice passed away January 14, 1969 and is buried in the Ebenezer Cemetery.

Euna married William Reed Moore in 1920. They had 7 children: Amelia, Leontine, Peggy, W. T., Holland, and a set of twins, Helen and Clellan Moore. Euna died February 16, 1975 and is buried in the Ebenezer Cemetery.

Robert Talmadge was inducted into the Army during WWI. He served from September 1917 to July 1919, having spent 10 months of that time overseas. He married Lena Pearl Wilkerson in 1928. They had two sons: Floyd and Garland Hayes. Robert T. died March 15, 1979 and is buried in the Griffin Cemetery on Ebenezer Road located just over the Taylor County line.

Leander and Maggie were happily married for over 50 years. They enjoyed life with their children and fourteen grandchildren and even got to know several of their great grandchildren. Leander passed away February 11, 1944 at the age of 78. His funeral was conducted at Liberty Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Taylor County in the presence of his family and many friends. He was buried in the cemetery there.

Maggie passed away four years later on May 1, 1948 at the home of their daughter, Euna. She was 81 years old and had been ill for about a year and a half. Her funeral was conducted at Ebenezer Presbyterian Church with burial by her husband's side.

Today, there are numerous descendants of Leander and Maggie that carry the surnames of Hayes, Moore, Givens, Coffey, Russell, Shuffett, Rowland, Clark, and so on.

Leander and Maggie were a typical rural couple living in Green County at the turn of the twentieth century on a farm with their three children; neighborly, Christian folks that worked hard and enjoyed life.

Leander Richard Hayes had been born January 7, 1866. His parents, James Garner Hayes and Elizabeth Ann Stubbs, were married in Green County in 1855 and made their home in the Haskinsville area. Their nine children were Nancy C., Alonzo M., Charles G., Leander, Lillie B., Benjamin Luther, Florence A., William, and Minnie Hayes.

Maggie's given name was Margaret Temple Rucker. She had been born February 2, 1867. Her parents, William Augusta Rucker and Loutitia Bratton Rucker, were married in Taylor County in 1850. Their eleven children were William Joseph, Robert F., Richard T., Sarah Francis, John B., Ann Elizabeth, Maggie, Letha Jane, Isiah David, James Allen, and Henry Alexander Rucker.

In their youth, Leander and Maggie each became members of Good Hope Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Lemon's Bend. They both completed school through the sixth grade.

Leander, age 24, and Maggie, age 23, were wed on October 9, 1890 at her family's home in Green County by Rev. T. W. Wells.

The newlyweds started a family of their own right away. Twin daughters, Eunice and Euna, arrived June 11, 1891. A bouncing baby boy, Robert Talmadge, was born August 15, 1893.

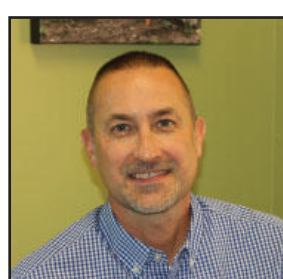
The Hayes lived around the Gresham community where Leander had a farm. They
