From the very beginning, Memorial Day has been a time for Americans to stand together and say, "Thank you. We remember you. We are grateful to you." Let us continue that tradition today.

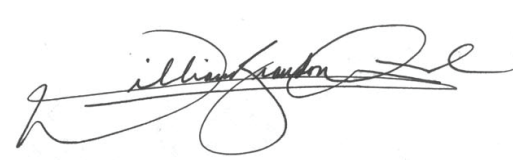
