

XC runs at CHHS Fairground Fenzy

The Green County Cross Country Varsity Lady Dragons placed fifth as a team at the CHHS Fairgrounds Fenzy Saturday, September 9, held at the Hardin County Fairgrounds in Elizabethtown.

Medalist Riley Coffey led the varsity Lady Dragons in the 5,000 meter run, finishing ninth with a time of 20:40.17.

Also scoring were: 40. Chloe Fortner, 22:34.10; 41. Rebecca Stringer, 22:35.07; 48. Kody Pruitt, 23:00.20; and 53. Claire Goff, 23:15.38.

Additional results included: 69. Kally Corbin, 23:56.46; 87. Rylee Feese, 24:40.63; 108. Hadley Nunn, 25:56.15; and 126. Jewel Hines, 27:29.28.

The individual winner was Morgan Kobylinski, of Ohio County, recording a time of 19:02.16.

Green County finished fifth as a team, scoring 155 points. South Warren was the team winner with 32.

“We put a lot of focus into the importance of backing your teammates this season and this really showed Saturday,” said Coach Grant Karnes. “The gaps between our athletes continue to decrease, and you will see the team get stronger and stronger as this continues over the next several weeks.”

Jayden Marr led the varsity Dragons, finishing 11th in the 5,000 meter run with a time of 17:02.70.

Also scoring were: 40. Cody Swary, 18:25.90; 100. Layton Froggett, 20:03.40; 121. Reed York, 20:48.30; and 132. Jameson Hines, 21:12.80.

Brendan Nagle, of John Hardin, was the individual winner, recording a time of 15:28.50.

Green County finished 13th as a team, scoring 327 points. Meade County was the team winner with 79.

“High school is starting to see the results from all the hard work with a PR from Cody Swary and top season performances for several others,”

said Coach Adam Cecil.

The middle school Lady Dragons were led by medalist Ansley Bloyd, finishing fifth in the 3,200 meter run with a time of 13:14.70.

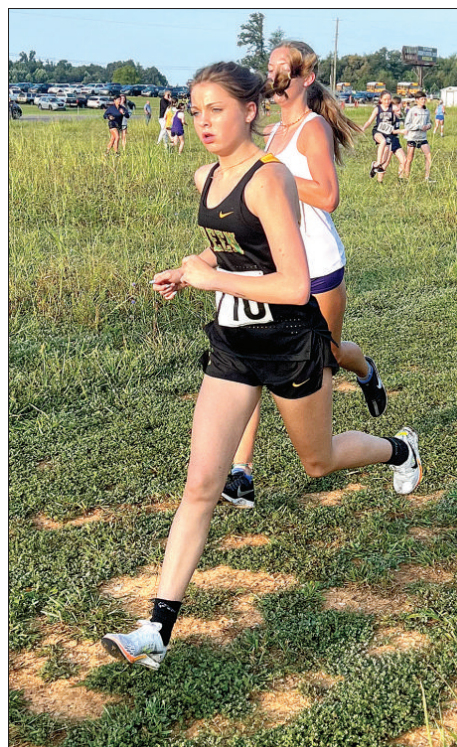
