home the All A Fifth Region Runner-Up trophy for the first time in history.

The Lady Dragons were back home last Tuesday in varsity and JV double-header against Russell County. Coming off their first loss of the season, the Lady Dragons' game plan was to start fast and take control. Green County did just that and jumped out to an early lead. At the half, the Lady Dragons led 3-1. The second half played out similar to the first for a 6-2 final score. Mia Blaydes led all scoring with four goals. Eastes and Marlee Ryan scored a goal each. Ryan had three assists. Coppola and Jaycee Keen each added an assist to the stat sheet.

On Saturday, the Lady Dragons took back to the road, traveling to John Hardin in the first matchup between the Dragons and the Bulldogs. Green County continued their winning ways, beating John Hardin 7-4. Blaydes again led the scoring with four goals. Eastes added the re-
