Rebels looking to take big step in building a winning program

Justin Palmer's master plan is to build a football program at Obion County Central.

This season will put his skills The Rebels come into the 2023

season following big graduation losses from the year before. Central graduated its top i

ning back, top passer, top receiver, top scorer and top two tacklers. Programs, he pointed out, can

absorb those losses and continue to win games. "The difference in a team versus a program is you just keep going when you lose all those

things," Palmer said. "It just continues on. That's the goal. "We'll see if that's the direction we're heading — if we're becoming a program versus just being a team from year to year. Three

we're becoming. We'll find out." Palmer enters his third season at OC fresh off a 2022 campaign where the Rebels posted a 6-6 overall record and beat Melrose at Memphis in the first round of

years into it, I hope that's what

the Class 4A state playoffs. Central had some playmakers everywhere who led to that success.

Johnny Light ran for 1,936 yards and 21 touchdowns, scoring 126 points, Ben Sharp threw for 1,154 yards and seven TDs, and Jamaad Mosley pulled down 55 catches for 838 yards and eight scores.

Meanwhile, Drake Hamilton had 60 tackles, and Colten Rudd had 53 stops to lead the Central defense.

"We won't replace those guys completely, but we have some guys in those positions that maybe are a little better than those guys at certain things," Palmer said.

For the Rebel head coach, that shows a flexibility that he believes his system has.

"Will our offense look the same as it did with Johnny? No. Will we run some of the same plays? Yes, but we've tweaked some of those plays to fit the players we have now. Maybe we'll ask the quarterback to do a little more. We counted on Jamaad a lot in the passing game. I'm a big believer in getting your best players the ball in whatever way you can. If everybody's a little more equal as receivers, then more guys get the ball. Maybe that makes us a little tougher to defend.

Defense is a little different because it's all about teaching them the right way of getting in a stance, getting lined up and being good tacklers. It doesn't matter who you graduate or who you have. If you don't do those three things, I don't care if you're running a 9-1-1 defense, you're not going to be very good. That really never changes in any good football team."

OFFENSE Quarterback

Hamilton May (5-10, 165), a senior, has the skills and leadership qualities to be a standout at that position.

"He's been one of our best olayers since I've been here," Palmer said. "It doesn't matter what position he's played. He's one of the best people we have in this program. I love coaching him. A coach couldn't pick a better guy to be the quarterback and leader of this team, honestly, just because he has the respect of everybody. I think he's going to do a great job and have a great year for us.

In limited action last season, May completed 17-of-21 passes for 99 yards and three scores.

Junior Logan Thompson (5-10, 185) is listed as the back-up.

Running backs Tucker Moore (5-11, 165), a sophomore, steps up to the starting spot in the backfield.

Not as big but maybe more elusive than Light, Moore will be more diverse in his role as he will be utilized in the passing game as well as being the primary ballcarrier.

Palmer calls his receiver positions 'X,' 'Y,' 'Z' and 'H' and each spot has a specific role in
