(Mark) Fenton of Henderson, Nev. He was preceded in death by his parents; brother, John S. Pope, Jr.; and nephew, Jed Pope.

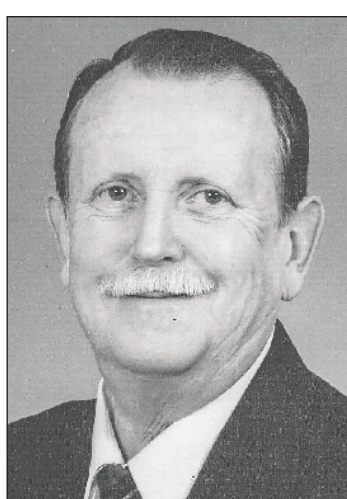

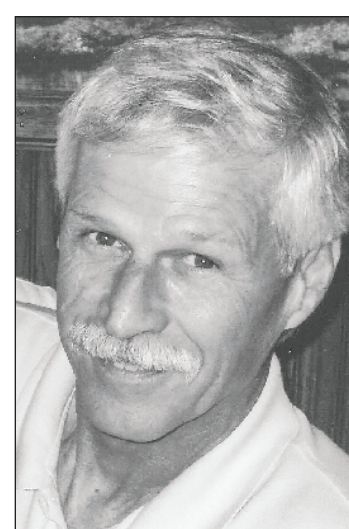

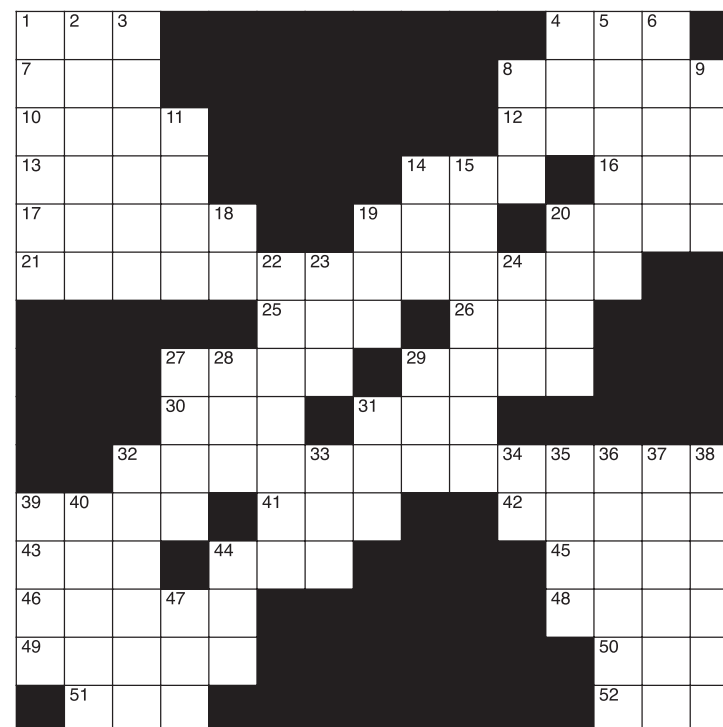
