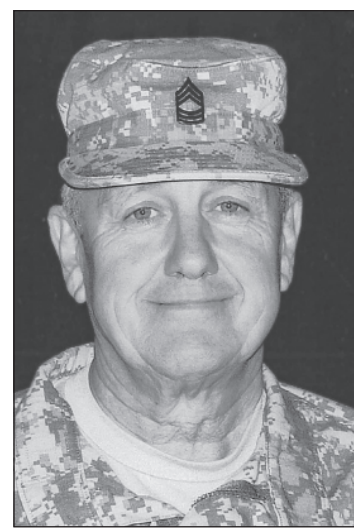
Gerry Baumann

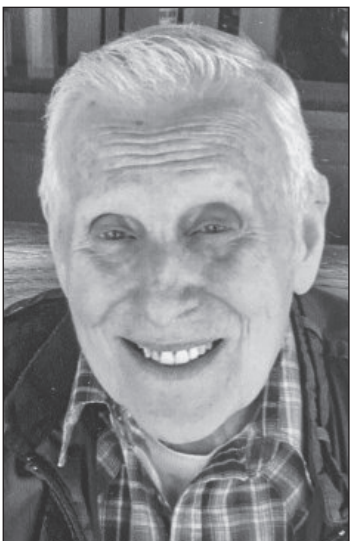
Mike Booten Jr.

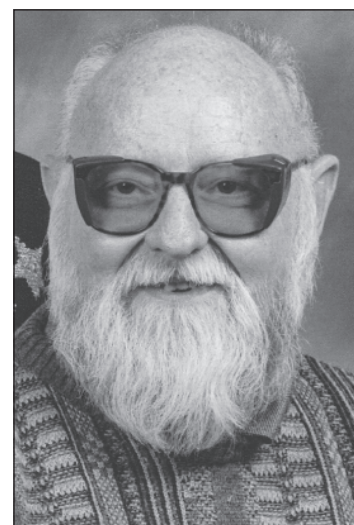
Bob Yeakley
