Tootsie Rolls made their debut on America's candy scene in 1896, when a Brooklyn man named Leo Hirschfield concocted the chewy, chocolatey treats. Hirschfield named the chews after his 5-year-old daughter Clara, whose nickname was "Tootsie." The treats have a long and storied history, and were even included in World War II soldiers' rations. Tootsie Pops came much later, by the way—not until 1931. Today, about 64 million Tootsie Rolls are produced every 24 hours, or roughly 740 per second.
