Douglas Henry Jurgens was born on November 16, 1941, in Urbana, and passed away unexpectedly after a brief illness in Green Valley, Ariz., on February 23, 2023.

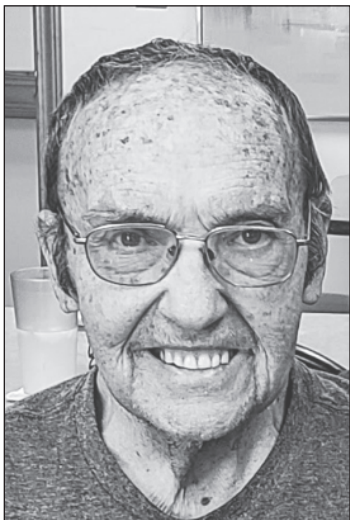
Billie was preceded in death by his parents; two sons, Tony Ray Snyder, and Don Austin Snyder; and one brother, Richard Snyder.
