Knights center fielder Karaline Vanausdoll keeps her eye on the fly ball in the JV game with Tuscola last week. Karaline would catch the ball for an out.



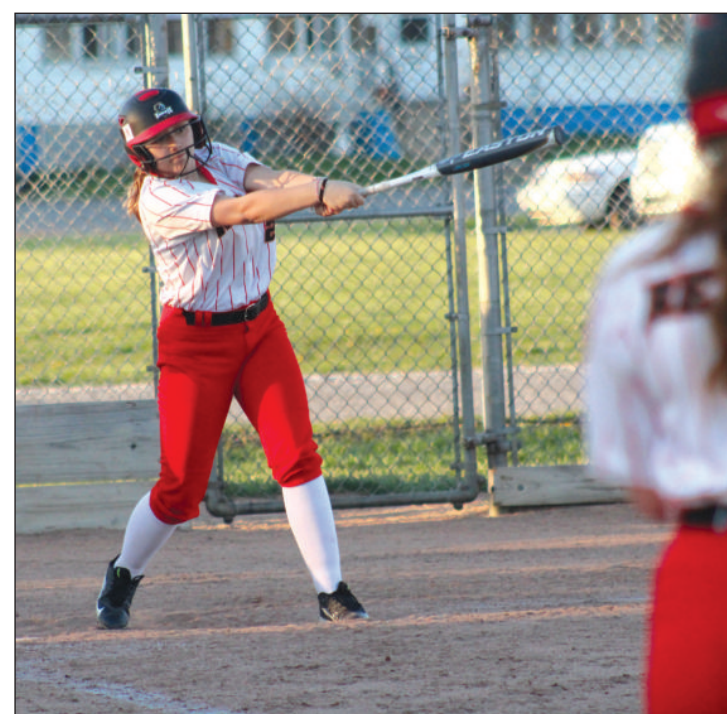
