



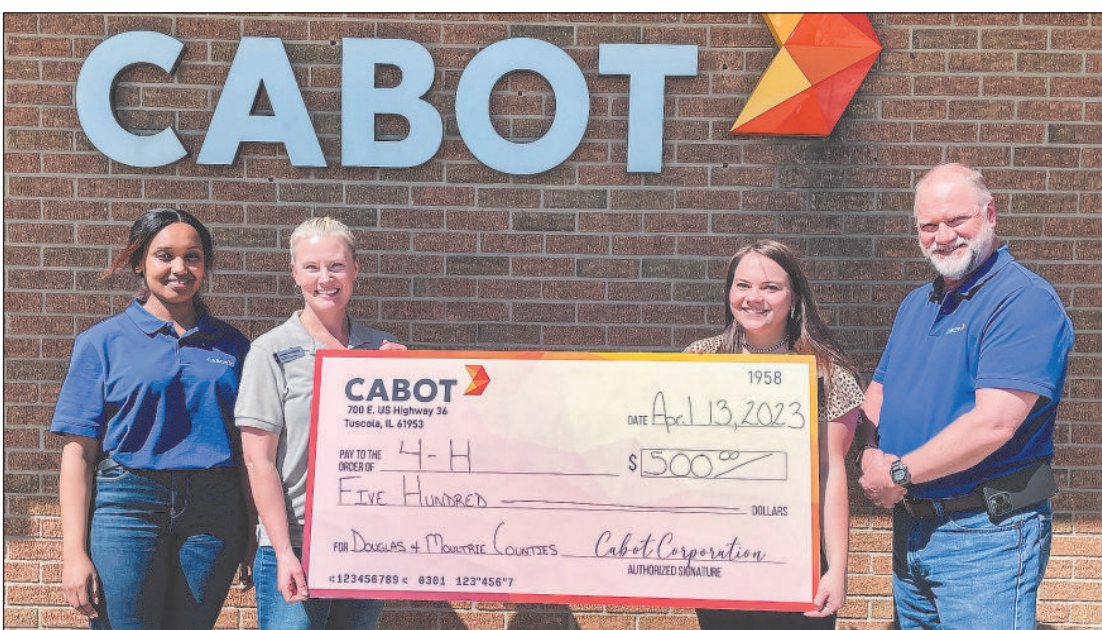
Donation to North Ward PTO – TIGER TROT
