

DOWN MEMORY LANE

100 years ago May 10, 1923

C. L. Boyer of Oakland stated that the Johnson Oil Refinery Co., was ready to begin work within the next week or two on their new filling station which will be located at the corner of Main and Chestnut Streets on the site at present occupied by Harvey Pulen's Feed Store.

The new city council swung into action Monday night and worked as smoothly as a newly oiled Cadillac. Only once was there the slightest sign of lack of unanimity of opinion and that was on the question of raising the salary of the cemetery sexton. Three voted for the increase of \$60 (\$1,059.07 today) to \$75 (\$1,031.74 today) a month and three against it. It was up to the mayor so he suggested that the motion be withdrawn and a compromise effected, this was done and the resolution was changed to \$70 (\$1,214.96 today) and passed unanimously.

It looks as though we ought to change janitors. Somebody turned the heat from central Illinois Tuesday and there was a winter's gale, a cold rain, a snowstorm and frost all within twenty-four's time. Walt Reinheimer and J. C. Ludolph had their windows filled with straw hats but had to put in a pair of earmuffs with each sale. Practically all outside opera-

tions ceased. It was one of the wildest May days within memory of old timers here.

50 years ago May 10, 1973

R. C. King announced his resignation as President of the First National Bank of Arcola. The Board named Joseph M. Monahan as President of the bank. King' has been with the bank since 1962 and was named president in 1968. Monahan joined the bank full time as Assistant to the President in September of 1972.

There will be some new faces at the Arcola Homestead and Loan Association according to Bill Klopfleisch, president. The newly elected board of directors includes Klopfleisch, Pat Monahan, Bert Gordon Jr., Raymond Holterman, Jim Monahan, Larry Graham and Pau Cunningham.

Lewis and Laura Williams last week announced the sale of the Broom and Broom Corn News to John and Mary File, publishers of the Arcola Record-Herald. The weekly publication serves the broom industry. The Broom and Broom Corn News has been published in Arcola since Feb. 27, 1912, when W. L. and Frank Collins came out with Vol. 1, No. 1. For 22 years prior to that time a feature in the

weekly Arcola Record-Herald called the "Broom Corn Corner" had been the major messenger of the broom and broom corn trade.

25 years ago May 14, 1998

The new Johnny Gruelle Raggedy Ann and Andy Museum in downtown Arcola will give fans a sneak peek during the Raggedy Ann and Andy Festival. The founders of the museum, Joni Gruelle and Tom Wannamaker, want to solicit ideas from the loyal Raggedy Ann and Andy lovers who attend the festival. The museum will open at the 10th annual festival in 1999.

Arcola will celebrate its affiliation with the beloved Raggedy Ann doll by hosting the ninth annual Raggedy Ann & Andy Festival this Saturday and Sunday, May 16 and 17. The event, sponsored by the Arcola Chamber of Commerce, is held in the downtown area on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. and Sunday from 8 a.m. to

4 p.m. Arcola is the birthplace of the late Johnny Gruelle, creator of the Raggedy Ann doll.

The Arcola school board unanimously agreed to replace or refurbish 270 lockers on the first and second floors of the building. Principal Randy Rothrock told the board the lockers are at least 50 years old and may be as old as the building, which was constructed in 1916. The projected cost of replacing and refurbishing the lockers is \$15,408 (\$28,055.51 today).

The computer is to be purchased at a price not to \$1,500 (\$2,731.26 today) and will include a zip drive.

10 years ago May 9, 2013

Arcola High School seniors Danelli Rabanlez-Hernandez and Alex Johns were selected queen and king of the prom last Saturday. The Prom was held at the Kaskaskia Country Club.

Kayli Seaman and Laynee Clark were recognized by the Arcola Sunrise Rotary Club as the April Seniors of the Month at the club's weekly meeting May 2. The award is named in honor of the late Helen Harrington, a former Arcola Rotarian and longtime teacher in the Arcola School District.

Arcola has long been known for its manufacturing of brooms. Perhaps a couple of those brooms can be shipped back to the Arcola High School boys' and girls' track teams after they "swept" through the Little Okaw Valley Conference meet Monday at Arcola. The girls made it a four-peat, winning the LOVC title for the fourth consecutive season, by scoring 179 points. Their nearest competitor, Arthur-Lovington/Atwood-Hammond, finished second with 137 points. The Arcola boys captured its second LOVC crown in

three seasons by amassing 174.5 team points. Arthur-Lovington/Atwood-Hammond's boys were also second with 142 points.

Sophomore pitcher Taylor Edwards pitched a seven inning no-hitter in a 7-0 LOVC win over Cerro Gordo Friday, May 3. Only an error in the first inning kept it from being a perfect game. Edwards had 19 strikeouts with only two balls put in play. Her first nine outs were strikeouts and her last eight were strikeouts. Edwards launched a two-run homer scoring Kauryn Karmazinas, a freshman, who had a leadoff single. Edwards, Klaire Karmazinas, Laynee Clark, Dania Mendoza and Kauryn Karmazinas had two hits each as Arcola, coached by Craig VanDeveer improved to 8-5 overall and 7-1 in the conference. Other members of the team, assisted by Lisa Edwards, are Lezlie Arguelles, Sydney Spelman, Kayla Kepley, Jordyn Edwards, Adrianna Garza, Cara Edwards and Hunter Gobert.
