He was preceded in death

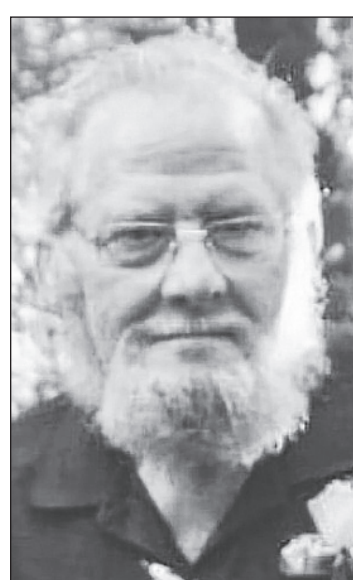
by his parents; wife; one grandson; one great-grandchild; and three siblings.
