

# Knights Softball Continue Winning Streak

The ALAH softball team had a busy week with two regular games and participated in a tournament on Saturday that ended early due to rain with the Knights leading 7-6 at the top of the second inning.

## ALAH Claims Lead in Fifth Inning to Defeat Arcola

The Knights ran off with the lead late in the game in a 3-2 victory over Arcola on Saturday.

The game was tied at two with ALAH batting in the bottom of the fifth when Kailee Otto singled on the first pitch of the at bat, scoring one run.

The pitching was strong on both sides. Madison Schweighart struck out six, while Keira Hohlbauch sat down five.

Arcola opened up the scoring in the first inning. Ava Simpson drove in one when Simpson singled.

The Knights evened things up at two in the bottom of the third inning when Mackenzie Condill grounded out, scoring two runs.

Schweighart was in the circle for ALAH Softball. The bulldog surrendered two runs on four hits over six innings,

striking out six.

Hohlbauch was on the rubber for Arcola. The bulldog went five and a third innings, allowing three runs on nine hits, striking out five and walking zero.
