She was a great cook; she collected music boxes, Strawberry Shortcake and Raggedy Ann and Andy memorabilia.

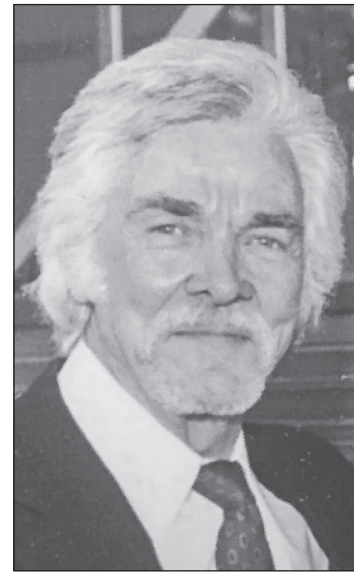
