Company of Pesotum is the general contractor for the project. A major portion of the funds for the project were received through a government grant.

- Howard A. Will, Jr., Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Soil Enrichment Materials Corporation (SEMCO) told the Record-Herald this past week that his firm is making efforts to reduce the odor emanating from SEMCO's Arcola site, located three miles south of Arcola. SEMCO's unit train tank cars during the last several years have carried more than a million wet tons of sludge from the storage lagoons of the metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago to two cities, one in Grundy County and the other in Arcola.

- The swimming pool committee of the Arcola Community Development Corporation this week released an artist's rendition of the proposed swimming pool to be built in Moore Memorial Park. A fund drive to raise the \$75,000 (\$523,759.41 today) required to build the pool will be launched this month by the committee. About half of the funds have been pledged, and if the goal is reached the pool will be built in the off-season for operation next year.
