Through this process of setting short-term goals and serving as a role model, volunteers provide encouragement and friendship to a student needing to build his/her self-esteem.

Mentors may come from many backgrounds and experiences. The main qualification for a mentor is that they

have a desire to give their time and talent in order to enrich children's opportunities and the school community in general.
