They will begin by putting out a "call for artists" via lo-

If the council is able to find businesses who are willing to partner with them, the art from the individual who is named "artist of the month" will be showcased in that particular business and that business will get promo-

tion throughout the month. Artist Don Chambers also offered the possibility of adding the business in the background of his comics that he publishes in the newspaper for added exposure as well.

The council will create a contract that will be both for the artist and businesses regarding the pieces of art and the artist for legal purposes and for any possible liability issues. With businesses and artists working

together, people of the community have a chance for more exposure to local art.

When artists showcase their work, they also can have an opportunity to sell their artwork if they wish as well. The artists could also donate a portion of it to the business as a thank you to them for allowing them to display the art or even to the council to help other artists within the community.

The art council already has a few businesses and individuals in mind for this new possibility and hope to get started with their endeavor soon. They also will be in the Arthur Cheese Festival parade using Richard Herschberger's wagon and a few of them will be walking along handing out fliers to those watching.
