As you drive by Arthur Lovington Atwood Hammond High School, have you ever wondered, what really goes on in our building? Each week we hope to bring you insight into what high school is like in today's world. Whether you loved your own high school experience or look back on it with dread, we hope to give you insight into what it is like to be a high schooler in 2023. Did you know ... We have 294 students enrolled in high school. We have 49 faculty and staff members that make our school run smoothly every

day. Our faculty have over 300 years of combined classroom experience. Our certified faculty work alongside a committed group of non-certified staff that have degrees in everything from nursing to psychology to communications. We have over 30 faculty and staff that also work as coaches, class sponsors, and supervise extracurricular activities. We have a newly formed debate club, a military service club, photography, drama, game and art clubs to name a few. And there are proposals from our students for ultimate frisbee and e-sports!

We aren't just here for athletics and clubs. We also work hard at making sure that we are providing a top-tier education. In addition to offering core classes like English, Math, Civics, History, and Science, we are able to offer 69 different elective classes, such as journalism, CAD, accounting, art, current events, photography, culinary arts, ag mech, marketing, and music appreciation. Our list goes on and on and is always being evaluated and updated. For the last seven years we have been able to offer multiple different dual credit courses

as we partner with Eastern Illinois University and Lake Land College. A dual credit course allows a high school student to earn high school credit AND college credit simultaneously. Most of these courses are taken on our campus with our faculty teaching and supporting. The cost for the college credit is at a discounted rate. Last May we had multiple students earn enough college credits to enter college as sophomores! And if that isn't enough we are also excited to be able to offer courses off campus that students attend for part of

their day. These include Health Occupations, where students may earn their CNA, Auto Tech, CEO (which is an entrepreneurial class), EMT (where students may earn their EMT license) and the LIFT programs in Mattoon. We work hard to include real world audiences for our students and their projects. Our English IV classes are working on writing the common app essay for colleges, so that everyone has the opportunity to have support if they want to apply to college. Our Broadcasting class is helping the Village of Arthur record

the Arthur Cheese Festival Parade and their Sesquicentennial Banquet. After the class edits these recordings it will be posted on their Facebook pages and our YouTube Channel. Our Ag Mech class works with TriCounty Welding at their facility to learn to weld. Our work co-op class allows students to work part time during the school day as they gain work experience, a paycheck and high school credit!
