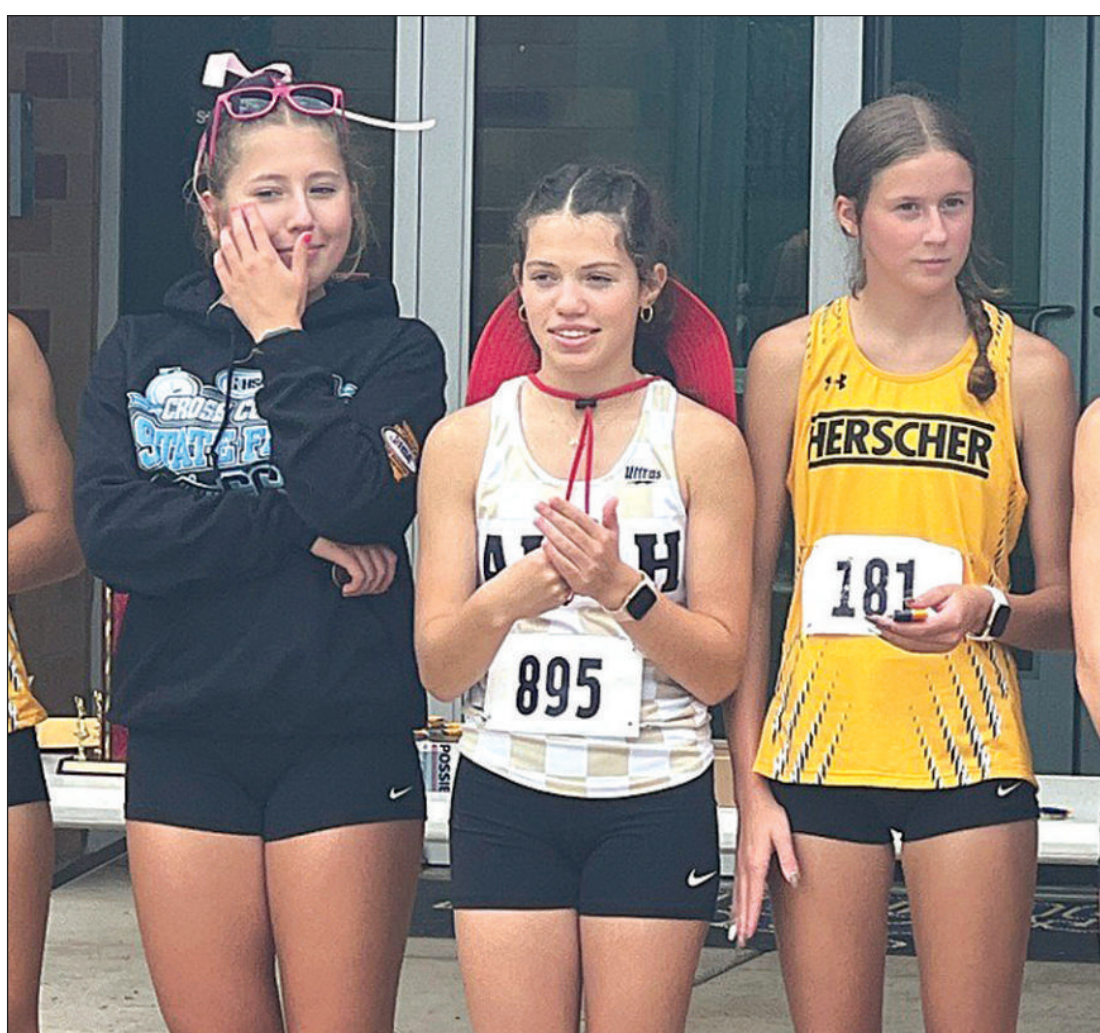
Knights sophomore Forman goes up to return the ball over the net to Monticello in the championship match of the JV Knights Classic Volleyball Tournament last Saturday.
