ed frequently by Jim throughout life, guided him or simply matched what was bred in him as he grew up in Arthur.

His life revolved around dedication to work and his own beloved family. His first career of 32 years was spent at the First National Bank of Chicago in the Law Department. A fellow banker said, "He was far and away the best bank attorney that I ever worked with providing solid advice. He was always so intent in assuring that we charted the right path in whatever it was we were working on to assure that we did the right thing."

After that, he embarked on a second career of almost 20 years in the State Bank of Arthur following in his father's footsteps. Jim found great satisfaction in thoroughly throwing himself into his job and doing it in the best way

he could. Only COVID-19 sent him into retirement at the age of 78.

Jim adored his family—wife of 57 years, four children and spouses and 10 grandchildren spread all over the country from Seattle to Chicago to South Carolina to Florida to Arizona and Michigan. Family holidays and trips were the highlight of his life. 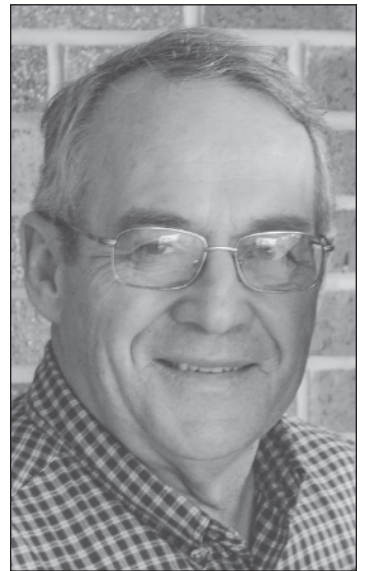
