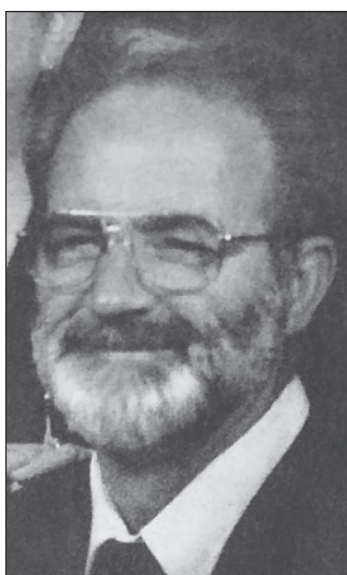

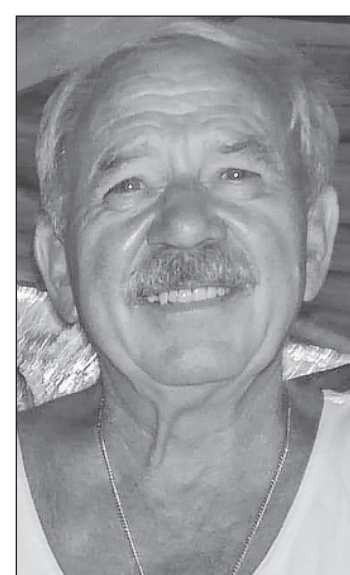
Dan enjoyed boating, and he always enjoyed spending winters in Costa Rica with Elise.
