She was preceded in death by her parents; husband; two sons, Tom and Rick Kingery; four brothers, Glenn, Earl, Loren, and David Hanners.

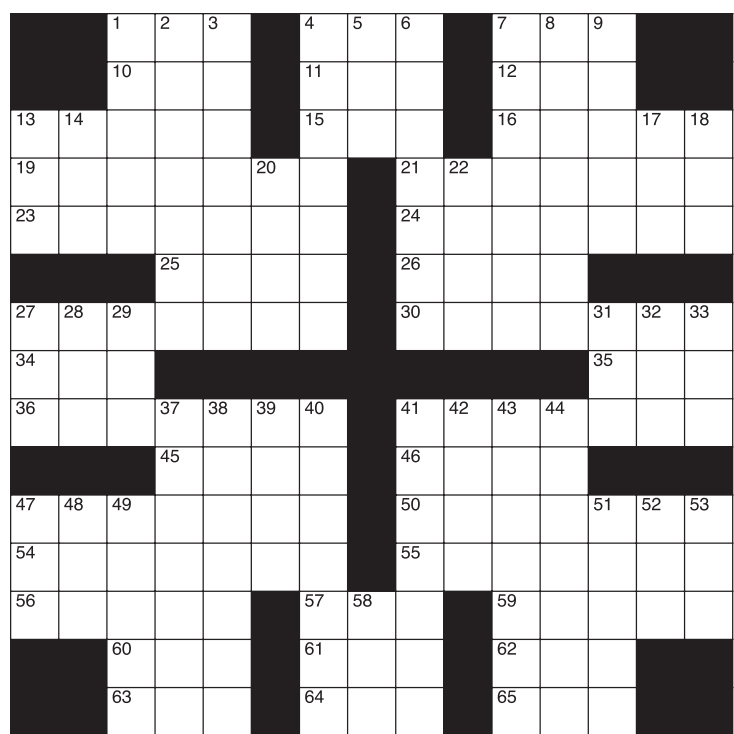
