Ada was a member of the Old Order Amish Church.

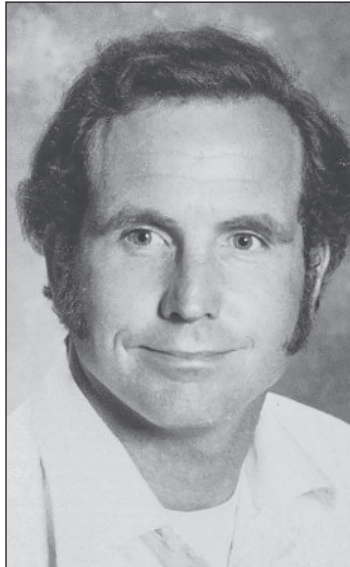
James Stevens Sr.
