## FEMA approves storm funding

On Sept. 15, FEMA approved Illinois' request for 19 counties, including Douglas and Moultrie counties, to receive public assistance following the severe storms and flooding event June 29 - July 2. With this addition, federal

funding is now available to state, local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work, debris removal and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the disaster in Christian,

Clark, Coles, Cumberland, DeWitt, Douglas, Edgar, Hancock, Macon, McDonough, Monroe, Morgan, Moultrie, Pike, Sangamon, Scott, Vermillion, Warren and Washington counties.

### 'Ghere Bowl'

#### Friday in Arcola

When Villa Grove fans leave their home football field named "Russ Ghere Field" on Friday night, Sept. 22, they will travel to longtime county and conference foe Arcola and when doing so, they'll turn into Arcola High School's Thomas-Bradford Field off "Ghere Brothers Memorial Highway" on Rte 133.

In Arcola, the Ghere legend is poignant and memorable and serves as the Arcola version of "Saving Private Ryan." Arcola-born Roy and Lillie Ghere sent all seven of their sons to fight in WWII. One son, Bobby, was killed in action in Germany in 1945. The other six brothers went on to become model citizens and community leaders. One of them, Russ, achieved great success as a coach at Villa Grove from the late 1950s to mid-70s.

at 6:50 p.m. Friday, Sept. 22, at Thomas-Bradford Field, Arcola High School. About 40 Ghere descendants are expected to attend the 75th football game between the two towns. VFWs from both towns will be participating in the program.
