NOTICE OF CHANGE OF CONDITIONAL USES IN MXD ZONING DISTRICT

The Town of Lantana proposes to adopt the following Ordinance:

On **Monday, April 8, 2024 at 6:00 PM**, or as soon thereafter as possible and which may be continued from time to time and place to place as necessary, in the Town Council Chambers, located at 500 Reynolds Circle, Lantana, Florida, the Town Council will hold quasi-judicial public hearings to consider and make a final determination on the following applications:

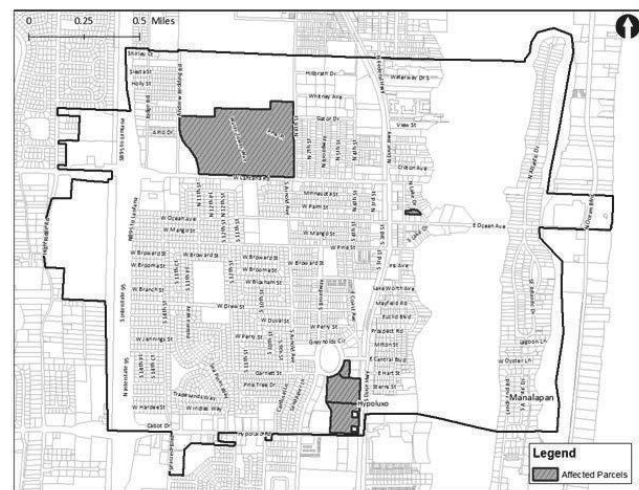
ORDINANCE NO. O-03-2024

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LANTANA, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 23 ZONING, BY AMENDING SECTION 23-101 - MXD MIXED USE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT. TO MODIFY THE ALLOWABLE DENSITY; PROVIDING THAT THE REMAINDER OF CHAPTER 23 SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT AS PREVIOUSLY ENACTED; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, AND AUTHORITY TO CODIFY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Town Council of the Town of Lantana will hold a Public Hearing on **Monday, April 8, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.** at Town Hall of the Town of Lantana, Florida, 500 Reynolds Circle, Lantana, Florida, or as soon thereafter as possible which may be continued from time to time and place to place as necessary in order to consider the proposed Ordinance.

All interested parties are invited to appear at the meeting as may be continued from time to time and to be heard with respect to the proposed ordinance. A copy of Ordinance O-03-2024 can be inspected and copied at the office of the Development Services Department during normal business hours of 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. All interested persons are encouraged to come to the public hearing and be heard.

If a person decides to appeal any decision of the Town Council with respect to any matter considered at such meeting or hearing, he or she will need a record of the proceedings, and that, for such purpose, he or she may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.
