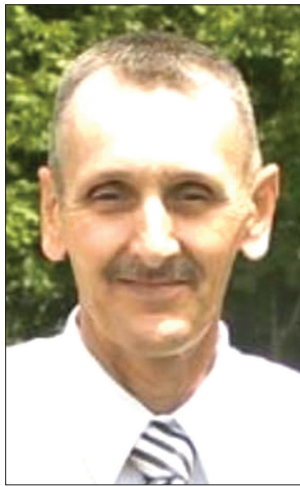
Timothy R. Berry, 61

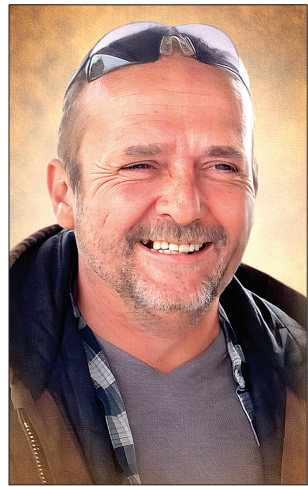
Tommy Dean Price, 50
