

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) nated into four categories: — with assistance from county agricultural inspectors, township supervisors, and city mayors — helps protect residents of the state from the negative effects of noxious weeds. A noxious weed is an annual, biennial, or perennial plant that damages public health, the environment, public roads, crops, livestock, or other property. Noxious weeds

nesota Noxious Weed Law.

Noxious weeds are desig-Prohibited Eradicate, Prohibited Control, Restricted, and Specially Regulated. The highest priority weeds are in the Prohibited Eradicate category. To prevent these species from becoming widespread throughout the state, the law requires species in this category to have all above and below ground plant parts destroyed.

Collaboration with multiple agencies and organizations throughout the state helps the MDA successfully detect noxious weeds in the Prohibited Eradicate category and confirm unrecognized species. In 2023, two Prohibited Eradicate species were confirmed for the first time in two counties: •Species: Palmer amaranth (Amarannthus palmeri);

hailstone •Species: Red (Thladiantha dubia); Fillmore County.

Palmer amaranth is a highprofile noxious weed of row crops. Red hailstone is an herbaceous perennial vine with heart-shaped leaves, tendrils, and showy yellow flowers; the vines have underground tubers that make it a challenge to manage.

The number of new county finds of Prohibited Eradicate noxious weeds has decreased since 2019. Several species (meadow knapweed, poison hemlock, and round leaf bittersweet) were moved from the Prohibited Eradicate category to the Prohibited Control category in 2023; in prior years, those species were found in new counties multiple times. After years of surveying and mapping these species, they were too widespread to be considered for the Prohibited Eradicate category.

The MDA verifies reports and collects voucher samples of Prohibited Eradicate noxious weeds when possible for the official University of Minnesota herbarium records. The MDA also helps local governments with weed management and enforcement of the Minnesota Noxious Weed Law. The MDA provides training to the county agriculture inspectors (CAIs) while the CAIs enforce the Minnesota Noxious Weed Law.

A Fresh Look From the Cass County DFL

Precinct Caucuses: Democracy in Action at the **Local Level**

What is a precinct caucus? Why do we have them? Can anyone go, or just a select few?

A precinct is a neighborhood, so a precinct caucus is a meeting of neighbors to conduct grass-roots political activity. By participating in a precinct caucus, we build and protect democracy according to the principles of our chosen political party.

Caucuses on Tuesday, February 27 are an important opportunity for each of us to act locally to address topics of importance to us. They are also the beginning of the 2024 election season.

2024 is an especially important election year! We will be electing a U.S. Senator and the President of the United States! Minnesotans will also be electing all seats for the US House of Representatives and Minnesota House of Representatives.

At the heart of a Democratic-Farmer-Labor (DFL) caucus are the resolutions that caucusgoers draft and act on. A resolution, simply put, is a statement about an issue or topic that you care about. The issue can be as close to home as clean water or as far-reaching as global

A draft resolution with the title of "Clean Water for Everyone" could state that all Minnesotans should have access to clean, pollutionfree water in their homes. If this was your resolution, you would share it with your neighbors at the caucus. They would likely suggest refinements and, quite possibly, combine your resolution with other draft resolu-

tions on the same issue. Almost certainly, others at your caucus will have resolutions for discussion. They may have drafted them using the DFL Resolution Form located on the DFL website (https://dfl.org/wp-content/ uploads/2023/09/2024-MN-DFL-Resolution-Form.pdf), but they are just as likely to have put some thoughts down on a scrap of paper or simply have an idea in mind. Even if you don't have a draft resolution in mind, you can provide valuable DFL input on resolutions brought forward by others.

Resolutions that are approved at precinct caucuses move up the line to the county convention where they are typically combined with resolutions on the same topic from other precincts. Resolutions approved at the county convention flow up to the State DFL Convention. Resolutions approved there form the DFL party platform and action agenda. Through the resolution process, each and every caucusgoer helps to define the DFL party platform and set agendas for candidates, and, ultimately, our elected officials.

That's right. Your resolution on Clean Water for Everyone could wind up in the DFL party platform!

Each Cass County DFL caucus is convened and chaired by a volunteer. You and your neighbors will elect a precinct chair, vice chairs, delegates to the county convention. (Serving in one of these roles is a terrific way to become even more engaged in the DFL.) You may meet candidates for office. Seasoned caucusgoers lend a hand to people new to the process.

Anyone who will be of voting age at the time of the November 5 general election can participate. In 2024, for the first time, Minnesota Democrats who are at least 16 years old by November 5 can also participate in caucus discussions, although they will not be able to vote on caucus business.

Cass County DFL caucus sites are in Cass Lake, Pine River, Lake Shore, Pillager, Remer, and Walker. The precinct you live in determines which caucus you will attend. You must go to the site assigned for your precinct. Use the Caucus Finder at caucus.dfl.org to determine your precinct's assigned caucus site. Registration begins at 6:30 p.m., and caucuses convene promptly at

7 p.m. Show up on February 27! Hear what your neighbors have to say. Let them know what is important to you. Remember, a precinct caucus is democracy in action at the local level.
