Home From Jap Prison

T. Sgt. Daniel Nugent, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dan Nugent, who has been a prisoner of the Japs for the past three years, has recently returned home.
Sgt. Nugent was among the 248 American soldiers recently liberated from Japanese prison camps. He was reported missing in June 1942 and later listed as a Jap prisoner of war. He was serving in the Philippines at the time of the fall of Corregidor and Bataan. He was captured on Guam.
Dan enlisted when just 20 years of age and was one of the first Hancock county boys to volunteer for army service through the local Selective Service office. He entered the service on Jan. 21, 1941, and received his basic training at Ft. Knox, Ky.
