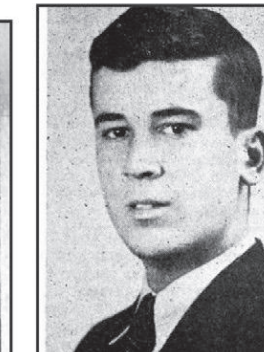
Charles W. Corley, S.C. 2/c
