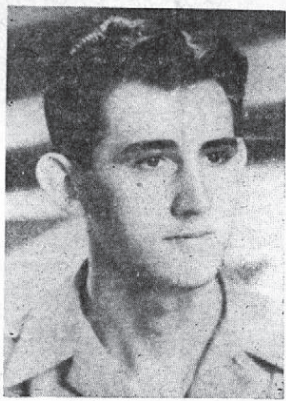
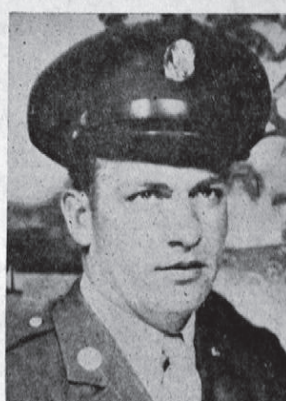


Brothers Have Re-union In Italy

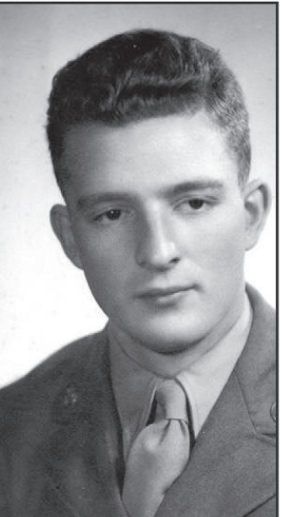

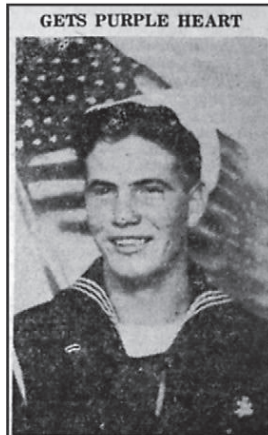


PFC. CHARLES E. GRAY

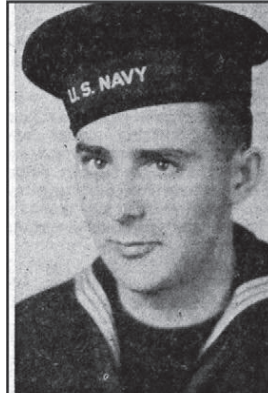
