(Continued from Page 1) pleaded guilty to the same charge. She faces a mandatory minimum of 10 years in prison, with a possible maximum sentence of life, and is scheduled to be sentenced on March 19.

According to court documents, investigators began looking into Harris in 2022 after suspicious packages containing illegal drugs were delivered to a residence on Travis Lane in Clinch County. During a search of the home, agents seized approximately 731 grams of methamphetamine,

including liquid meth hidden in bottles. Bridget Harris was observed placing the packages into a vehicle before the search.

The investigation

included the DEA, GBI, Clinch County Sheriff's Office, Georgia Department of Natural Resources, and Department of Homeland Security.

2026 Community Development Block Grant

The City of Homerville is considering applying to the Georgia Department of Community Affairs for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) of up to \$1,000,000 (single-activity) or \$1,250,000 (multi-activity). These funds must be used to primarily benefit low- and moderate-income persons.
