The Greene County Career and Technical Center offers students a wide variety of options when preparing for their future. The center offers students the opportunity to learn many valuable skills in trade industries such as construction and welding. The center also offers classes that equip students with skills and knowledge to advance them in other areas such as Business Technology, Law and Public Safety, Engineering, Agriculture, Food Service and Health Care.

Many of these programs offer a national certification in their area and the ACT-WorkKeys exam is now given to every student in the 2nd year of their program.

Mrs. Lott, Director for GCCTC stated, "These students work so hard to meet their goals. They go above and beyond every day. They show tremendous skill, work ethic, and dedication. We are so proud of each of them and all they have accomplished while here with us. This is just a small way to recognize their accomplishments."

The GCHS class of 2026 has 59 students who earned the CTE (Career and Technical Education) Endorsement. To receive a CTE endorsement, students must:

- Successfully complete at least 2 years of a CTE program
- Score Silver or higher on the ACT WorkKeys
- Maintain a 2.5 GPA
- Earn 26 Carnegie credits
- Complete either 1 dual enrollment course, work-based learning, or earn a national certification

- Maintain a 2.5 GPA and 95 percent school attendance while in high school
- Have no out-of-school suspension or severe disciplinary infractions
