Lady Titans fall to Bishop Kelley in round two

The Carl Albert girls soccer team saw their season come to a heartbreaking end Thursday night with a 2-1 double-over-

time loss to Bishop Kelley in the second round of the playoffs.

The Lady Titans finished the season 12-1 and as district champions.

Carl Albert fell behind early when Bishop Kel-

ley's Kate Colombin scored off a corner kick in the opening minutes. The Lady Titans answered in the final minutes of the first half when Abigail Oldham raced down the right side and connected with Vanessa Campbell on a cross for the equalizer.

Carl Albert controlled possession for much of the match, including both overtime periods, but could not capitalize on several scoring opportunities. Bishop Kelley's Dani Seikel scored the game-winner with 5:30 remaining in the second overtime period.

"We got the first goal down in the first three minutes of the game, and then we fought back," Carl Albert coach Quan Tran said. "We battled. We had so many chances. We actually had more chances than they did to finish."

Tran said the Lady Titans dominated much of the game but could not convert their opportunities.

"I think we dominated that second half," Tran said. "We just couldn't get it in. We had so many opportunities. I don't think they had one shot the second half, really."

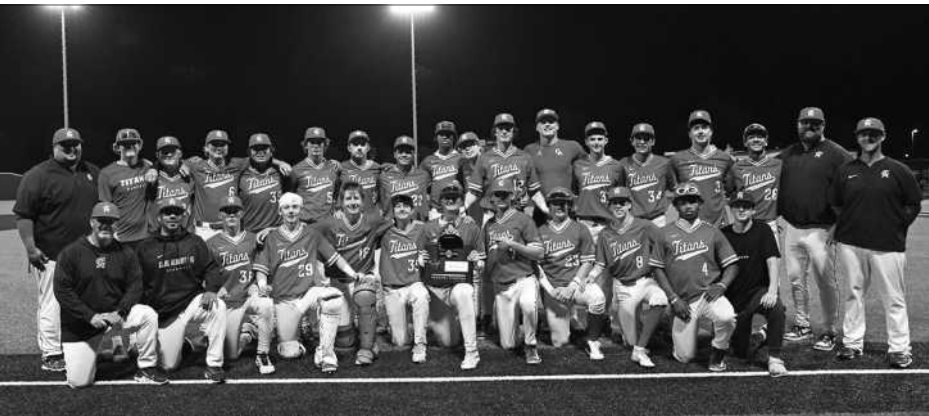
One of Carl Albert's best chances came late when Oldham narrowly missed a shot in the final minutes of regulation.

"I told them moments in the game win us the game or lose us the game," Tran said. "We had that one moment right there with Abby that she missed it, and then we had that

one right there where the goalkeeper got a hand on it and it went in the goal."

Tran was proud of his team's effort, especially the seniors.

"They left it all on the line, and they played their hardest," Tran said. "The seniors played so hard tonight and put it all on the line."

home runs from Camdyn Brown and Hawkins and a four-hit performance from Carson Ring, who also earned the win on the mound.

Later that day, the Titans defeated McGuinness 11-1, as Joaquin Golden homered and Sexton drove in a run. Avery again dominated on the mound, striking out eight without allowing an earned run.

After the regional title, Hawkins said Carl Albert's ability to maintain energy and tempo made the difference in a tighter championship game.

"We knew that being a regional championship is going to be a good game. You know, they're going to give everything they have, their season is on the line," Hawkins said. "We just kept it, kept the pace the whole game. That helped

us a lot." Head coach Ryan Whiteley said McGuinness presented a stronger challenge in the final after Carl Albert cruised through the earlier rounds.

"I think anytime you have a team that's fighting for their season, you're going to get a pretty good effort from them," Whiteley said. "I thought they played a really good game themselves."

Whiteley also credited his team's focus despite schedule adjustments and delays.

"We kind of gave them a little heads up warning that it might be a possibility," he said. "They came out after the delay and they were energetic, fired up. You've got to try to keep that rolling into next week."

Offensively, Whiteley said the Titans' power has been a bonus, but not a necessity.

"We have some guys in the top to the middle part

of our lineup that can get a ball out," he said. "But we're not going to rely on those. They're definitely nice whenever we get them."

On the mound, Whiteley praised the depth of his pitching staff throughout the regional.

"We had Carson Ring and Alex Cavazos come in and throw strikes, and they did a great job of keeping us intact," he said. "Avery pitched a great game to get us into the finals, and Perrymore is just a strike thrower. Defense played really well behind him."

Looking ahead to the Class 5A state tournament May 14-16 in the Tulsa area, Hawkins said the group is motivated by last year's early exit.

"We have a great run at state. I think we have got the guys to do it. It's just about how bad do we want it, what are we willing to do for it," he said. "We want it bad."
