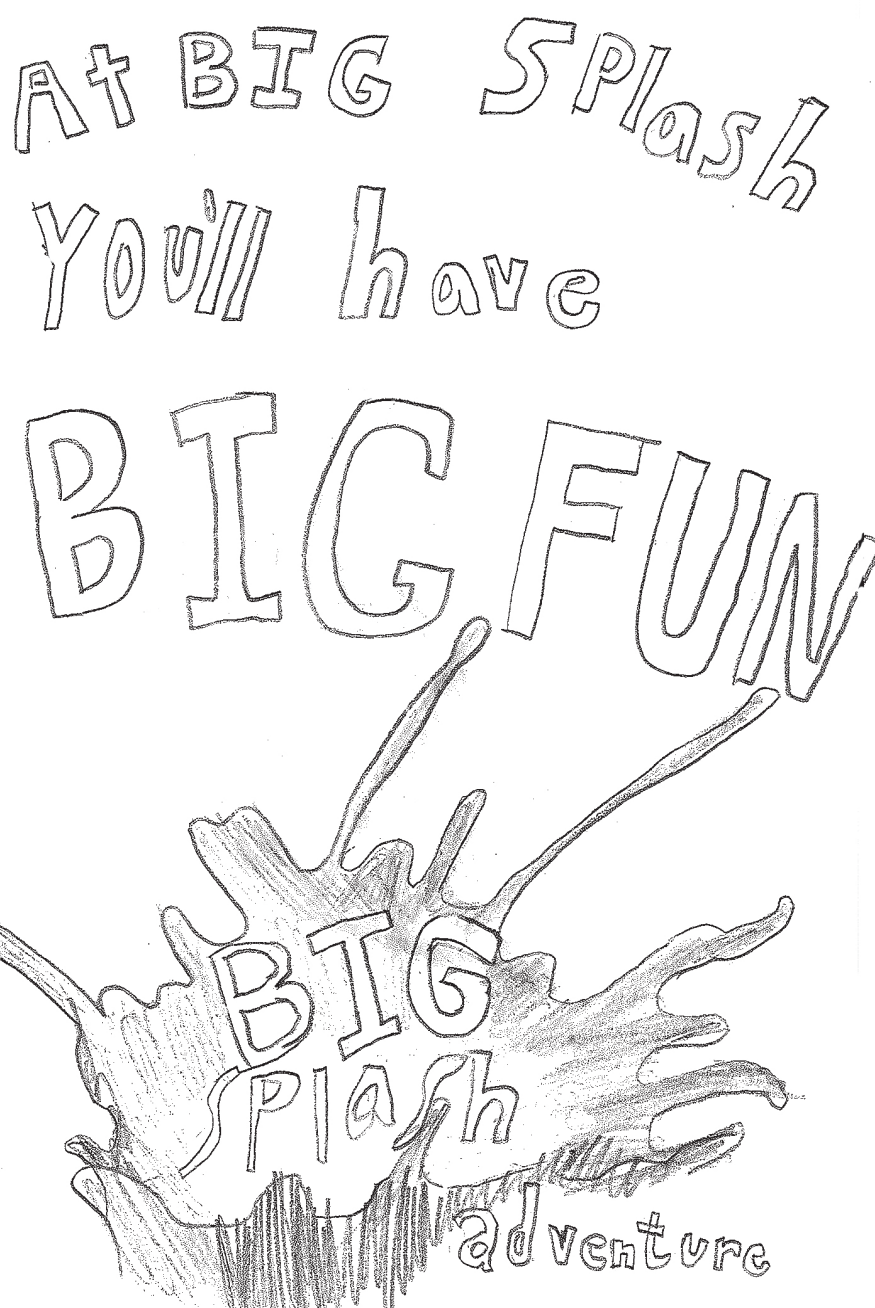

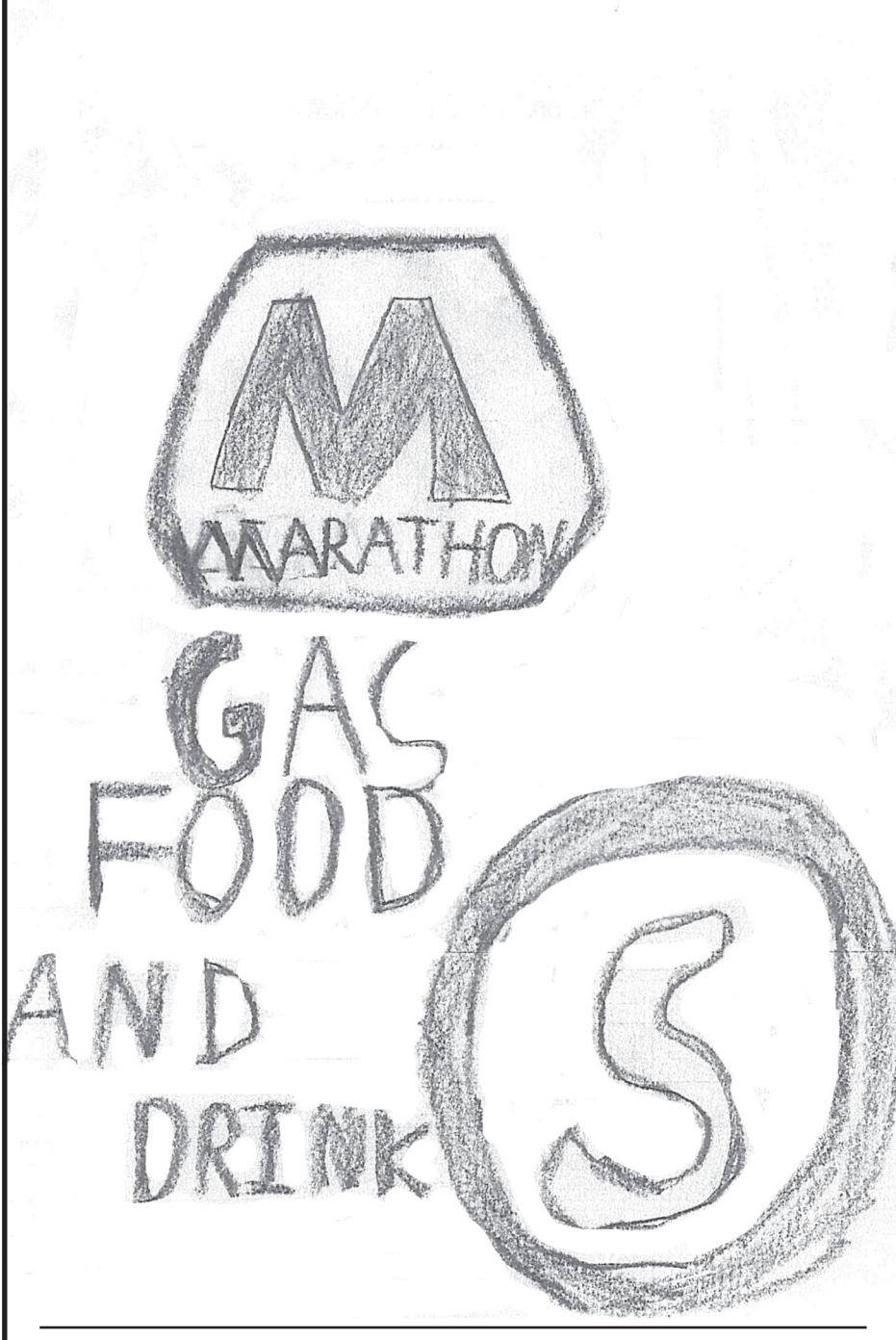
There were 13 original rules, here are a few. The first rule according to
