

GCHS archers place second at Boyle County

The Green County High School Archery team finished runner-up in the Boyle County New Year's Bullseye Tournament Saturday, January 17, at Boyle County High School in Danville.

The GCHS archers accumulated 3,299 points. Western Hills High School was the team winner with 3,327.

Lady Dragon Kylie Turcotte was the top Green County High School girl archer, finishing first overall among all high school girl competitors, shooting 289.

Also, placing fifth among all high school girl archers was Mad-die Underwood with a score of 280.

Dragon archers finishing with scores in the top 10 among all high school boy competitors: 4. Hunter Pierce 287, 7. Drew Judd 280, and 9. Brayden Rayburn 279.

Did you know?

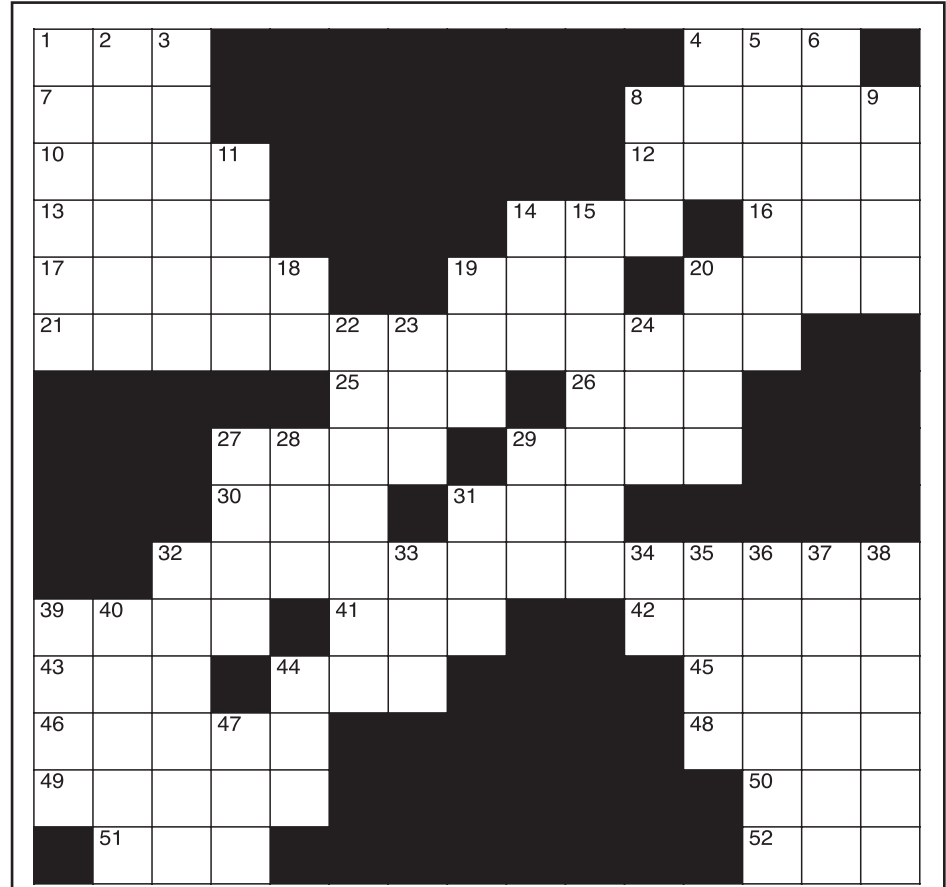
