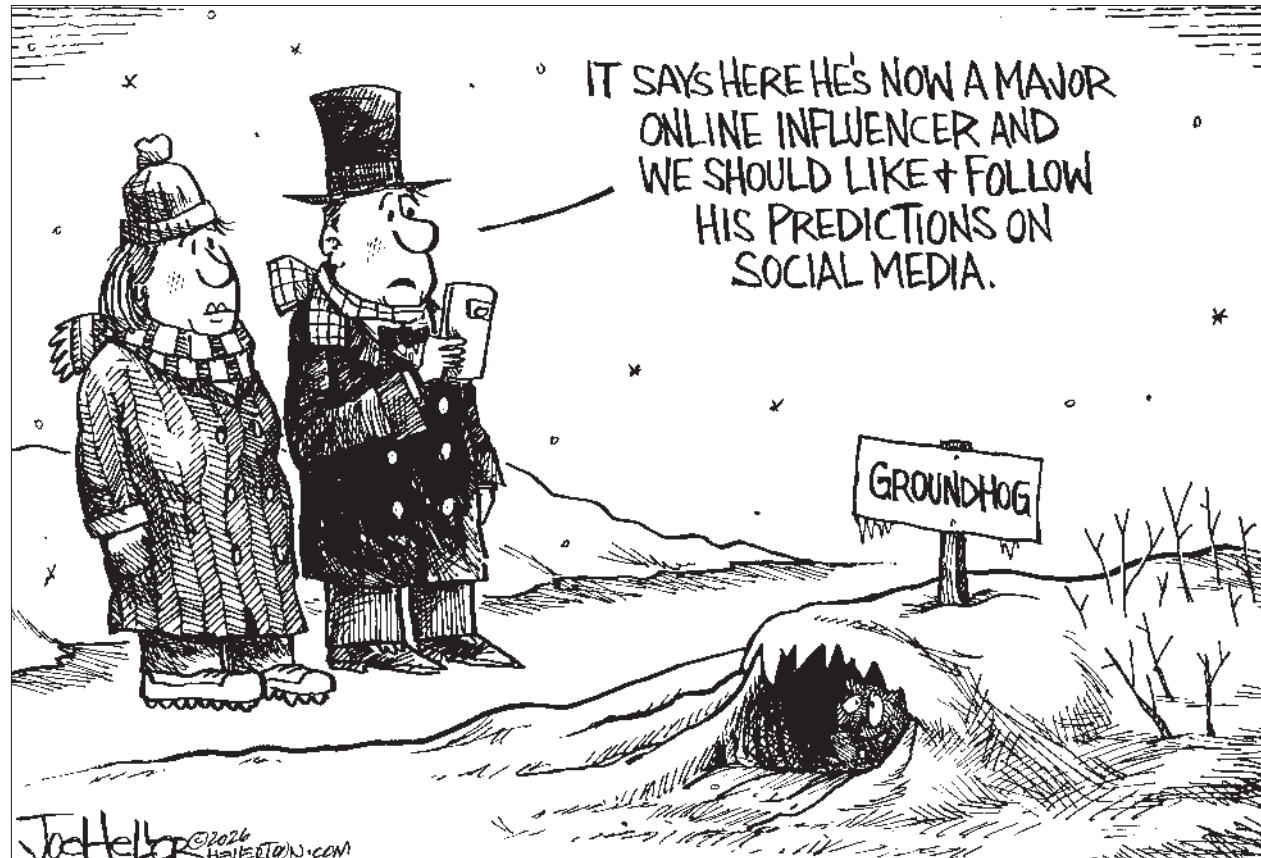

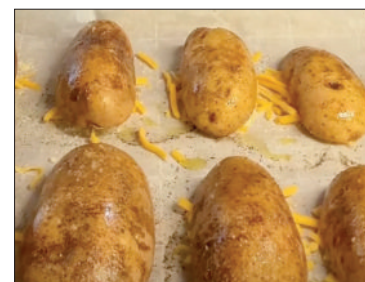
Cheesy Half Potatoes

This easy recipe is one I found on Facebook while snowed/ice in the house! It is different than baked potatoes, but also similar. Reminds me of a cross between a baked potato and potato skin! The cheese ends up being just crispy enough and the inside of the potato is soft and tender. Give it a try!
We topped ours with a bit of sour cream. Yum!

Cheesy Half Baked Potatoes

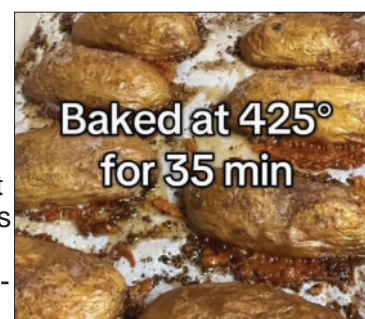
Ingredients

- 5 Smaller russet potatoes (Other potatoes would work)
- Shredded Parmesan cheese
- Shredded cheddar cheese
- Stick butter
- Olive oil
- Salt/Pepper



Wash whole potatoes. Slice potatoes length wise in half, leaving skin. Toss or brush potato in olive oil and salt and pepper.

On baking sheet lined with parchment paper for easier cleanup, add two pats of butter for each potato. On top of butter, add a sprinkle of Parmesan cheese and cheddar cheese (or your preferred cheese!) Put potato half flat side down on top of butter/cheese pile (Round side with peeling is up) Do same for all potatoes.



Baked at 425°
for 35 min

Bake at 425 degrees for 30-35 minutes until potato is tender with fork.
