At least one returning Lindsey Wilson student is also named a Begley Scholar each spring.

## PreK registration is April 17, 24, May 1

Green County Pre-school is accepting student applications for the upcoming 2026-27 school year. Preschool registration days are Friday, April 17, April 24 and May 1. Parents/guardians with a child that will be four-years-old by August 1, 2026 or a three-year-old that qualifies based on possible developmental delays, should contact the Board of Education. If there is a concern for a 3-and 4-year-old child's speech skills, social skills, or their

ability to use self-help skills, or if the family may qualify for preschool due to lower income at this time, contact Green County Board of Education. To schedule an appointment for registration, contact Kaylea Stearman, Family Resource Center, at 270-932-6619. The following documents are required for applications: birth certificate, income verification, immunization record, social security card, dental exam, wellness exam and eye exam.
