

Lady Dragons win two in final week of regular season

Green County defeated Central Hardin and Cumberland County last week to wind up the regular season with a 21-8 record. The Lady Dragons are hot as they end the season, winning eight of their last nine games as well as 14 of their last 16 games. The losses were to Nelson County at home and to Bishop Brossart in the All A State Tournament in Owensboro.

The win at Central Hardin avenged last year's loss to the Lady Bruins in the first round of the 5th Region Tournament. Green County lost by 12 in that game at Marion County to end their season.

This trip to Central Hardin, however, which is also the site of this year's 5th Region Tournament, was much more productive as the Lady Dragons came away with the win.

The Lady Dragons built a lead through halftime, going into the locker room with a six-point advantage. During the third quarter, however, Central Hardin cut that in half, to trail by just three entering the last quarter.

While shooting no free throws in the first half, the Lady Dragons had to make a living at the free throw line in the second half. They hit 13 of 20 foul shots,

including eight of ten in the fourth quarter. Central Hardin, on the other hand, did not shoot a free throw in the game, as the Lady Dragons committed only 10 fouls in the entire game.

The Lady Panthers came into the game sporting a 22-5 record and the number two ranking in the 4th Region. They also knew that they had won the last three games over Green County but the Lady Dragons were prepared.

Cumberland County scored first in the game on a long-range bomb but Green County rattled off the next ten points. Cumberland County hit another three before the Lady Dragons hit the next six points to take a 16-6 lead over Cumberland County.

During the second quarter, the Lady Dragons were faced with playing with two of their starters on the bench for a great deal of the quarter. Brockman and Clopton had to sit with two fouls each and Cumberland County be-

gan to cut into the lead.

Brockman and Clopton returned to the lineup for the third quarter, and they were the only two who scored in the quarter. Brockman scored the first seven for Green County and Clopton added two points. Fortunately for the Lady Dragons, Cumberland County scored the same number of points in the third quarter to still trail by four.

In the fourth quarter, Cumberland County upped the pressure and with just 44.9 seconds

remaining in the game, Green County was clinging to a one point lead.

Green County had the opportunity to put the game away but they missed four free throws all with less than 30 seconds to go. Cumberland County, however, committed two turnovers even with the ball under their basket very late in the game and Green County walked away with the win.
