

GC Track & Field delivers stellar performances at indoor state

The Green County High School Boys' and Girls' Indoor Track and Field Teams produced a number of exceptional performances during the KHSAA Class 1A State Championships Tuesday, March 3 at the Norton Healthcare Sports & Learning Center in Louisville.

Those athletes who had runner-up performances resulting in podium finishes included: Cayden Cecil in the pole vault with a vault of 11 ft. 6 in.; Carly Goff in the high jump with a height of 4 ft. 8 in.; and Darius Anderson in the triple jump, leaping 41 ft. 6.25 in.

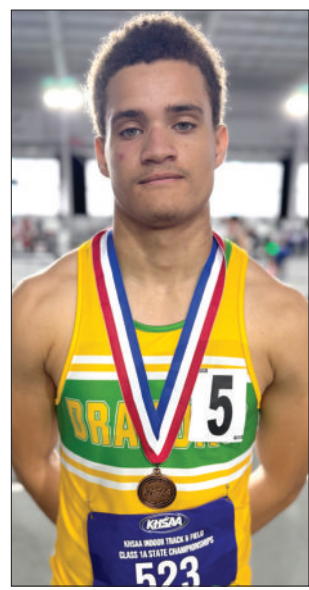

The Green County girls' team placed sixth overall, scoring 23 points. Lexington Christian was the team winner with 121.

"There's always more that we could have done, more points that we could have scored, and the final outcome could have been better; however, we competed well, showed passion that we had not seen for a while, and continued the tradition of success that our sport has had for a long time."

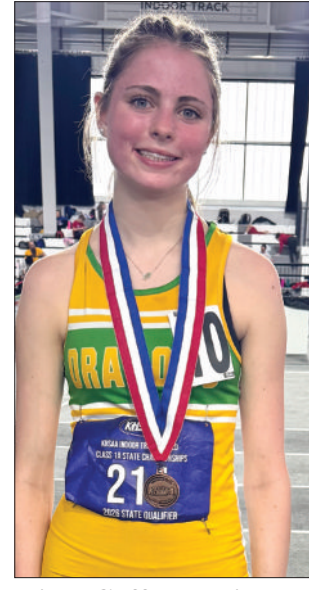
Scout Brockman placed 4th in Shot Put with a throw of 33-8 at the State Meet.
