In addition to these broader priorities, several pieces of legislation continued moving through the process this week.

The Senate passed my Senate Bill (SB) 173, which establishes a formal legislative review process for amendments to Kentucky's Medicaid state health plan. The measure strengthens oversight of major health policy decisions, including those affecting Medicaid, by ensuring lawmakers have the opportunity to review amendments submitted to federal regulators. As health policy and state finances become increasingly interconnected, it is important that the General Assembly remain engaged in the policymaking responsibilities entrusted to us.

Here are several other measures that are now with the House of Representatives for consideration.

SB 8: Modernizes the Kentucky Public Service Commission by expanding the commission from three to five members and establishing new qualification, term limit and political balance requirements. The measure strengthens oversight of utility regulation while maintaining the Attorney General's role as the statutory advocate for residential ratepayers.

SB 50: Modernizes Kentucky's probate, estate and trust laws by simplifying inheritance rules and authorizing electronic wills and estate planning documents while adopting nationally recognized trust standards.

SB 57: Establishes the Nuclear Reactor Site Readiness Pilot Program to support early permitting and site readiness for advanced nuclear energy development in Kentucky.

SB 125: Creates a clearer framework to identify and treat youth in the juvenile justice system with serious behavioral health needs through coordinated care planning and expanded treatment capacity.

SB 137: Creates a provisional medical license to help attract ex-

perienced international physicians to practice in medically underserved areas of Kentucky.

SB 156: Strengthens Kentucky's ban on child marriage by clearly prohibiting marriage for anyone under age 18.

SB 177: Updates licensure requirements for speech-language pathologists and assistants to align with current professional standards.

SB 191: Establishes a pilot program that rewards child-care providers for measurable

improvements in kindergarten readiness.

SB 192: Reduces regulatory burdens on small cities by allowing communities with less than \$15 million in revenue or spending to use simplified accounting methods.

SB 199: Aligns Kentucky pesticide labeling standards with federal EPA determinations by recognizing federally approved labels as sufficient warnings under state law while preserving liability protections for consumers.

My grandfather devised a large wooden cross, which he erected at the top of the hill for the service. It was a glorious sight to see the sunrise over the March Lilies on Easter Sunday morning and experience the community come together.

Depending on the winter weather, some years not too many flowers make it until spring, but in most years there is a good show. It is a favorite spot for photographers, both amateur and professional, to capture babies and children, and yes, adults too!

There is nothing more joyous than lying

in a field of flowers on a sunny day, and I have done it many times.

How long they have been there?

At least since the mid-to-late 1800s. I spoke to Mr. Frank Cantrell in the early 1970s to ask him about his memories.

His parents owned the property from 1895 to 1944. He was born in 1887 and remembered the flowers being there in his childhood.

Judge Richard Alyette Buckner built the brick house in the early 1800s, and there is a Buckner Cemetery in the corner of the March Lily field.

My grandparents, Garnett and Ethel Milby, bought the house

and farm in 1944. The farm remained in the family for many years, jointly owned by my cousins Melinda Hall, Jan English, Terri Talbott, and me. Our parents, Walter and Nancy Milby, and Morris and Evelyn Simmons passed the farm to us upon their deaths.

I was born in the Buckner House in 1949. Our roots grow deep on Buckner Hill.

I invite you to enjoy the flowers and the beauty of the earth on Buckner's Hill, while being mindful of the property owners and their privacy. I wish to honor the past of this historic property, while conserving it for generations to come.
