Green County Fiscal Court, in its regular called monthly meeting Thursday, March 19, approved the setting of dates for the 2026 White Goods Amnesty

Program. The event will be held April 23-25. "We are very pleased to be able to offer the White Goods Program again this spring. We appreciate the City of Greensburg partnering with us," said Judge-Executive John

Frank. "The guidelines are the same as in years past and everyone is welcome to contact the Judge's office with any questions. We very much appreciate the co-operation of Blake and Kasey Gordon for allowing us to use their

property for this event." In other business, magistrates approved: (1) The Soil Conservation Budget for fiscal year 2026-2027 (2) To purchase two Green County Rescue Squad vehicles with a cap on funds of \$50,000

(3) Salary increase proposal #2 for the Coroner and his two deputies, with yearly salaries being \$7,500 for Coroner and \$4,500 for each deputy (4) To award the Judicial Center mowing bid to Brian Burriss at a

cost of \$100 per mowing (5) To award the Courthouse/PVA mowing bid to Landscaping at a cost of \$60 per mowing (6) To reject the snow/ice removal contract bid

The Greensburg City Council, in its monthly meeting March 16 approved a zone map amendment request regarding Shady Lane Lots 12-17 as recommended by the Greensburg Planning and Zoning Commission.

"The map amendment allows for the development of brand new single-family homes along Shady Lane," said Mayor John Shuffett.
