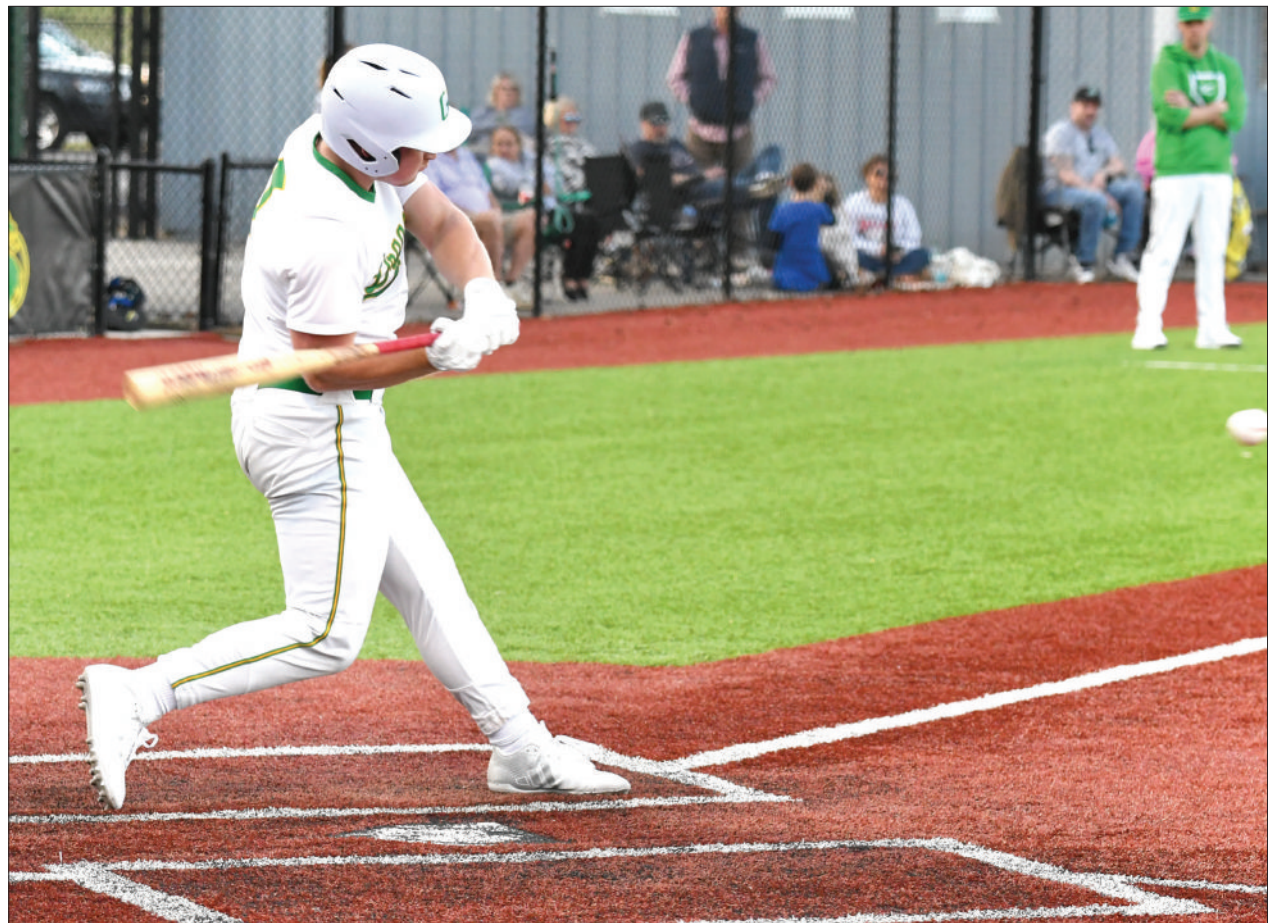
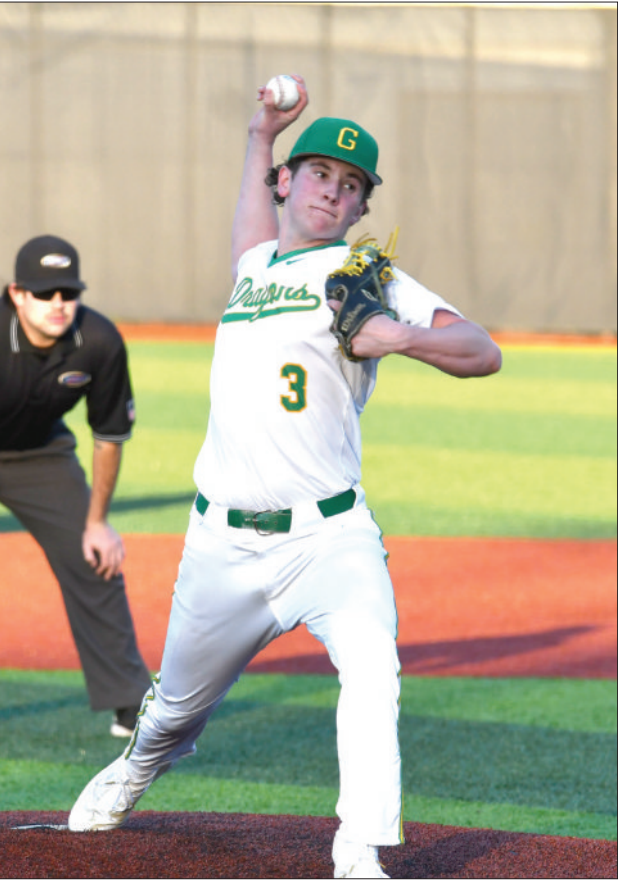


Caleb Corbin keeps his eye on the ball as he takes an at bat against Glasgow. The Dragons won their opening game of the season 7-6 against the Scotties.

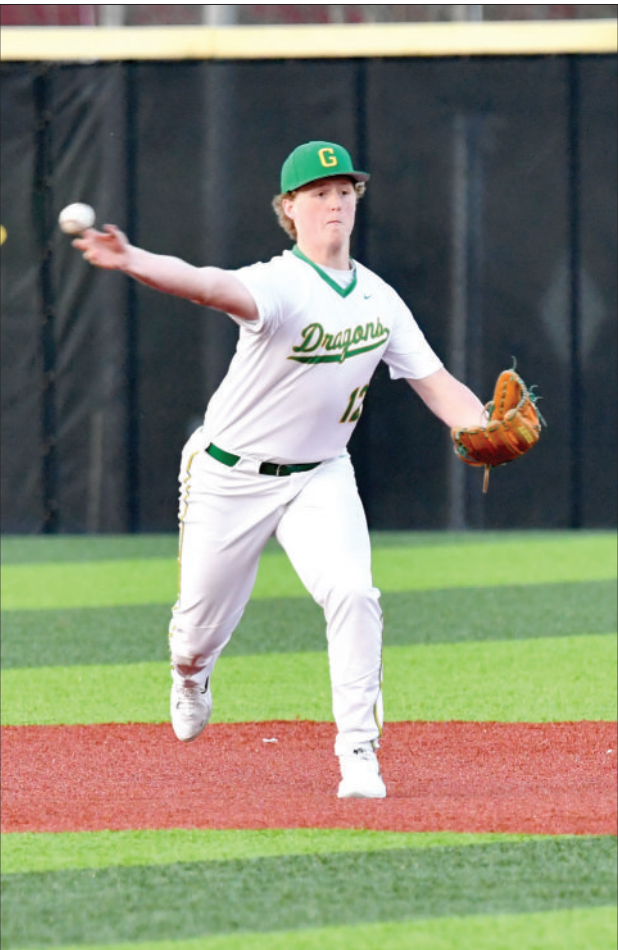

Dragons win first three games

The high school baseball team is off to a hot start, defeating Glasgow at home and then sweeping a double-header at Caverna Friday night. This gives them a 3-0 record, plus they are now 2-0 in the district.

As a team, the Dragons are hitting .438 in the first three games, and they've outscored their opponents 39-7.

Green County 7 Glasgow 6

After weather caused postponements earlier in the week, the Dragons got their season underway Thursday night with a win over visiting Glasgow.

After the Scotties scored two in the first inning, Green County retaliated with an explosive first inning. Larson Matney, the leadoff hitter, opened with a triple to center field. This was followed by home runs by Drew Squires and Andrew Houk. Cash Jones added the fourth run when Glasgow committed an error with Caleb Corbin batting.

Glasgow scored four runs in the top of the fifth before Green County's Squires slammed his second home run of the game to lead off the inning, pulling Green County within one run at 6-5. This set up the game for a dramatic win by the Dragons in the seventh inning.

Keelan Curry singled to open the inning. A sacrifice bunt by Corbin moved Curry to second. Ty Bonta and Reece Mitchell walked, loading the bases with just one out.

Carter Allen bunted down the third base line and Curry scampered home to tie the score. With the bases still loaded, Matney singled to right field, allowing Bonta to

score the winning run.

Green County 17 Caverna 1

The Dragons haven't lost to Caverna since 2011, and this double-header was yet another rout by Green County. The first game lasted just three innings as the Dragons were ahead by 17 after the minimum three innings. The Dragons scored three in the first and then exploded for 12 runs in the second inning as the Dragons sent 18 batters to the plate in that inning. The potent Dragon offense added two more in the third inning before allowing the Colonels to score just one in the bottom of the third. Durrett and Thomas combined to pitch a one-hitter against Caverna.

Green County 15 Caverna 0

The second game of the night was a

no-hitter pitched by Durrett and Matney. These two hurlers allowed just three baserunners during the four-inning game.

The Dragons' slogan in this game appeared to be score early, score often. They scored six runs in the first, five in the second, two in the third and two in the fourth as their picked up another win by a run rule.
