

GCHS Esports in its ninth year

Green County High School Esports is currently in its ninth year of existence, having begun in 2018.

This season the GCHS Rocket League team, Green County Dragons Gold, has defeated Marshall County 3-0, Henry County #2 3-0, Warren Central 3-1, and Ft. Campbell 3-2 in the best-of-five.

Its losses have been in the best-of-five to duPont Manuel 3-0 and Boone County 3-0.

Several area schools compete in the KH-SAA-sponsored online video game, Rocket League, during the spring season. They include besides Green County, Bardstown, Barren County, Casey County, Elizabethtown, Ft. Knox, Metcalfe County, North Hardin, Somerset and Washington County.

The local team is currently ranked 9th by PlayVS out of 56 Rocket League teams in the state. They have one remaining match this regular season before the state playoffs.

Rocket League is a popular fast-paced, physics-based competitive vehicular soccer video game developed by Psyonix. The game utilizes three players from each team where rocket-powered vehicles hit a large ball into the opposing team's goal and score points over the course of a timed match. It is known for its intense action, aerial stunts, and strategic teamwork.

At the end of the spring regular season, a tournament is held to determine the Kentucky High School Athletic Association's Esports champion for the Rocket League.
