Farmers Market opens Thursday

Farmers Market on Green River opens tomorrow, 3:00-5:30 p.m. CT, at the same location as last year, at The Cattlemen's Pavilion, 2385 Campbellsville Road in Greensburg.

According to Patsy Bishop, one of the vendors as well as one of the organizers of the market, they have many new vendors who have committed to being part of the market this year, as well as all the vendors who were there last year.

"Thursday, in addition to the beef for sale, we are expecting to have lamb and pasture-fed poultry," Bishop said. "We also will have some bakers with cinnamon rolls and other different things."

In addition to the meat

and baked goods, they are expecting vendors with homemade soap and other products.

"I have talked to some of our vendors, and they are hoping to have some Kentucky-raised tomatoes for sale on Thursday, too," Bishop added.

Again, this year, the market is participating in the senior cards which give senior citizens \$50.00 in free produce.

"Senior citizens need to apply at the Senior Center," Bishop said. "They can do this starting May 1, and they need to talk to Cathy Milby at the Senior Center who takes care of this."

According to Bishop, there



"We don't have any money yet," Bishop said, "but we are hoping that organizations and individuals in the county will donate money so that we can do this again this year."

Last year, there were enough donations that several Green County children received vouchers for \$10.00 that allowed them to shop for their own fresh vegetables and meat.

"If anyone wants to make a donation for this or if they have questions, please call me," Bishop said.

Bishop's phone number is 270-299-5512 or she may be reached on Facebook. The market has their own Facebook page that is usually updated weekly

through the selling season to showcase what they have for sale that week.

While they have several vendors who are expected to participate, they always can use some more. Bishop asked that people contact her to find out the rules and to get more information. The fee for setting up for the whole season is just \$35.00 for each vendor.

Bishop also pointed out that The Cattlemen's Pavilion has recently gone through some upgrades. It now has a concrete floor and there has also been expansion, giving plenty of room for more vendors.

Last year, Farmers Market on Green River frequently gave away gift cards in a drawing and Bishop expects that they will do something similar this year.

People with disposable items may enter between Tony's Discount and Kentucky Lawn Equipment and are asked not to bring items in an enclosed trailer.

Acceptable items include: appliances, furniture, batteries, and various types of scrap metal.

Non-acceptable items include: paint, oil, tires, propane tanks, garbage,

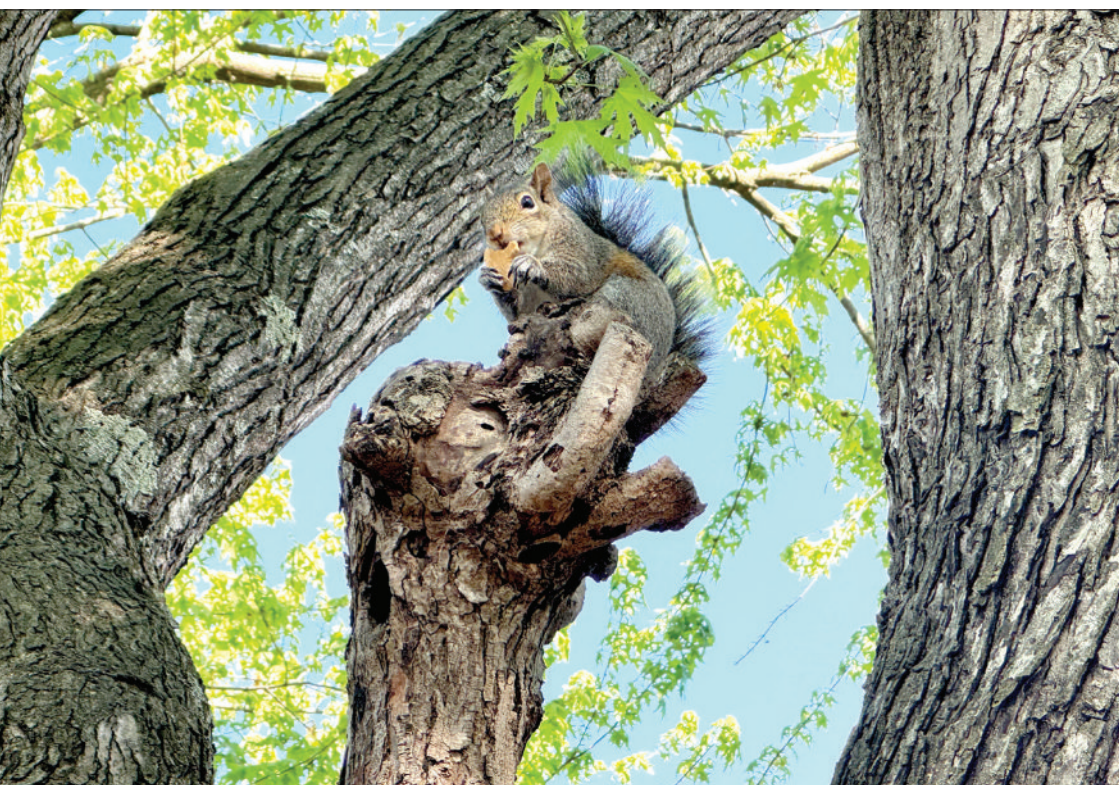
